

No. DCLXI.

An Act to provide for the further suspension of certain Duties of Customs.

[22nd September 1880.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Taxislation the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly of Victoria in the present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows (that is to say):—

1. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Second Schedule to Further suspension "The Duties of Customs Act 1877" or in any Act amending the same, no duties of customs shall be deemed to have been chargeable since the No. 593. thirtieth day of June One thousand eight hundred and eighty nor to be No. 646 s. 5. chargeable until after the thirtieth day of June One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one on the importation into Victoria by land or sea of agricultural implements known as reapers and binders.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Third Schedule to "The Duties of Customs Act 1877" or in any Act amending the same, no duties of customs shall be deemed to have been chargeable since the thirty-first day of August One thousand eight hundred and eighty nor to be chargeable until after the thirty-first day of August One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one on the exportation from Victoria by land or sea of any timber known as redgum.
