No. DCCXCIX.

An Act to remove doubts as to the power of the Governor in Council in certain cases.

[25th November 1884.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly of Victoria in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows (that is to say) :—

1. Where in and by any grant from the Crown or lease from the Crown or deed or document now in force or hereafter to be made any exception or reservation is made in favour of or any power is given to Her Majesty or Her Majesty her heirs and successors, the Governor may on behalf of Her Majesty or Her Majesty her heirs and successors take the benefit and advantage of any such exception or reservation and may exercise any such power in the same manner as Her Majesty or Her Majesty her heirs and successors might have done.

Powers given to and reservations in favour of Her Majesty may be exercised by the Governor.
