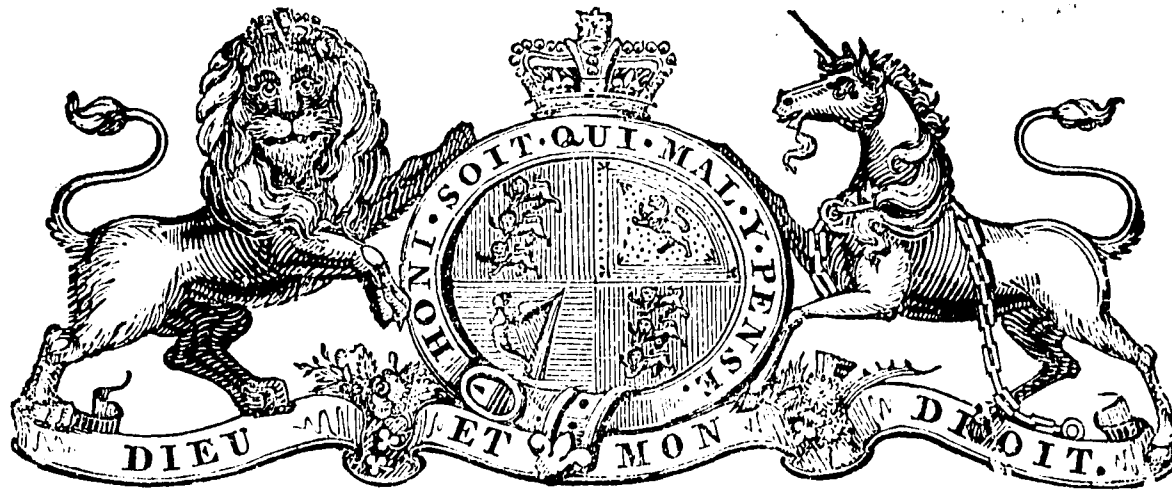

An Act to remove doubts as to the power of the
Governor under the forty-eighth section of
“*The Constitution Act.*”

[17th *December*, 1858.]

WHEREAS by the forty-eighth section of “*The Constitution Act*” the Governor is empowered to abolish any of the offices named in the third and fourth parts of the Schedule of the said Act marked D and whereas doubts have arisen whether the said Governor has power to restore any office which may have been so abolished In order to remove such doubts Be it therefore declared and enacted by the Queen’s Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Victoria in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows (that is to say)—

I. It shall be lawful for the Governor to restore any office named in the said Schedule which shall have been so abolished provided that such restoration shall not be inconsistent with the provisions of any Act now or which may hereafter be in force respecting any such office and provided also that the sums appropriated by the said third and fourth parts of the said Schedule shall in no case be exceeded.
