WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the tenth day of August One thousand eight hundred and seventy-four the land described in the First Schedule to this Act was reserved from sale permanently as a site for a market : And whereas the said Order in Council was revoked

revoked by the Colac Market Land Act 1903 so far as such Order related to the land described in the Second And whereas the remaining Schedule to the said Act : portion of the land so permanently reserved from sale which portion is described in the Second Schedule to this Act is not required for the purpose for which the same was so reserved and it is expedient to provide for the revocation of the said Order in Council so far as it relates to the said remaining portion in order that the same may be dealt with as unalienated land, of the Crown and may be permanently reserved from sale for a public park: And whereas the council of the Shire of Colac has consented to the said Order in Council being revoked as to the said remaining portion of the said land : Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly of Victoria in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows (that is to say) :---

1. This Act may be cited as the Colac Market Land Short title. Act 1916.

2. (1) The said recited Order in Council dated the Rovocation of tenth day of August One thousand eight hundred and seventy-four which was revoked by the Colac Market Land Act 1903 so far as such Order related to the land No. 1833. described in the Second Schedule to that Act shall be and the same is hereby revoked as to the remaining portion of the land described in the First Schedule to this Act which remaining portion is described in the Second Schedule to this Act.

(2) The said remaining portion of the said land shall be deemed to be and may be dealt with as unalienated land of the Crown, and may be permanently reserved from sale in accordance with the Land Acts for a public park.
