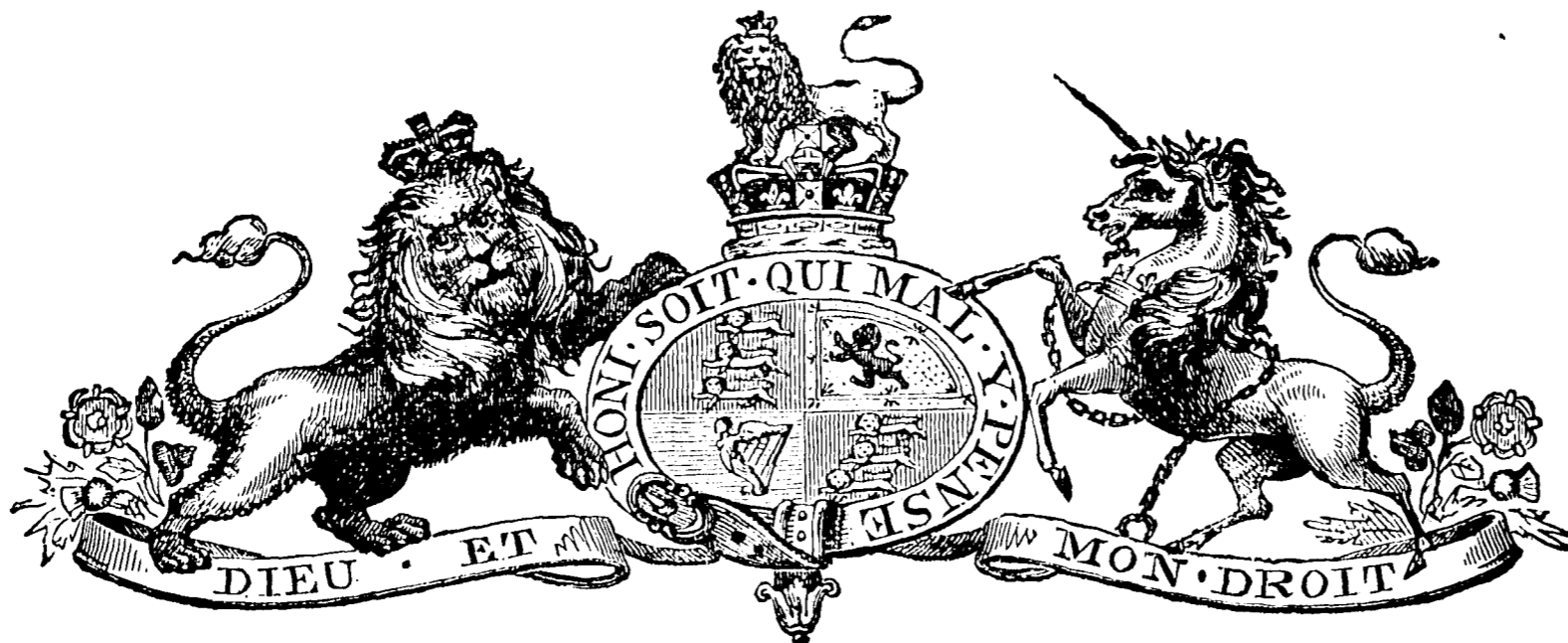

No. 1362.

An Act to amend the *Health Act* 1890.

[6th August, 1894.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly of Victoria in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows (that is to say):—

1. This Act may be cited as the *Health Act* 1894, and shall be construed as one with the *Health Act* 1890.

2. In section seven of the *Health Act* 1890 the following amendments shall be made, namely:—

Amendment of
section 7, No. 1098.

(a) For the words "the Chairman and the medical inspector" there shall be substituted the words "two members to be appointed by the Governor in Council"; and

(b) The following words are hereby repealed, namely:—"in accordance with the provisions of the *Public Service Act* 1890. He shall be an officer of the First Division of the Public Service and the permanent head of the Department."

3. The medical inspector shall be one of the two persons who shall be appointed by the Governor in Council to be members of the Board of Public Health, and one of such two persons shall also be appointed by the Governor in Council to be the Chairman of such Board.
