An Act to further amend the Health Acts.

[23rd December, 1907.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly of Victoria in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows (that is to say):—

1. This Act may be cited as the *Health Act 1907*, and shall be read and construed with the Health Acts. Short title and construction.

2. In section one hundred and twenty-five of the *Health Act 1890* for the paragraph beginning with the words "Whenever any place" and ending with the words "person sending the same" shall be substituted the following paragraph, namely:— Amendment of s. 125 of No. 1098.

"Whenever any municipal district or place in Victoria appears to be affected by any dangerous infectious or contagious disease the Board may by a notice published in the *Government Gazette* require and direct all medical practitioners and registrars of births and deaths to report all cases of such disease in such district or place. After the publication of such a notice every medical practitioner and registrar of births and deaths shall immediately on any case of such disease in any such Report of dangerous injurious or contagious diseases.

such district or place coming to his knowledge report the case to the Board and also to the Council of the district. Such report shall be made in such form and be transmitted by post telegraph or other means as the Board may in such notice require and direct."

3. In sub-section (g) of section twenty-four of the *Pure Food Act* 1905 after the words "of any article of food" there shall be inserted the words "or of any other article or of any substance or compound."

Amendment of
s. 35 of No. 2010.

4. In section thirty-five of the *Pure Food Act* 1905 after the words "No article of food" there shall be inserted the words "or other article or substance or compound."
