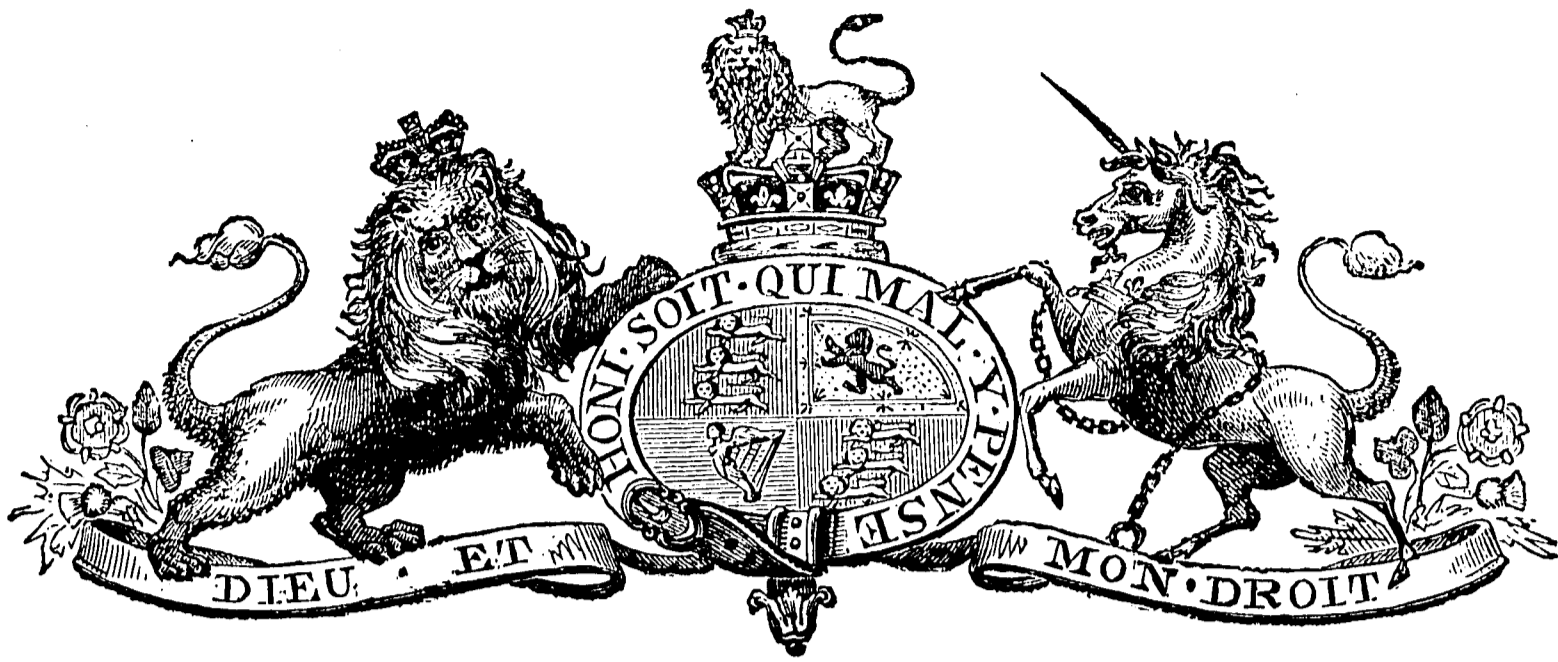

An Act to Reduce the Municipal Subsidy for the Year One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three.

[27th February, 1893.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly of Victoria in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows (that is to say) :—

1. This Act may be cited as the *Municipal Subsidy Act 1893*, and shall be read as one Act with the Local Government Acts, and such Acts and this Act may be cited together as the Local Government Acts.

Short title and construction.

2. (1) For the year commencing on the first day of January One thousand eight hundred and ninety-three the amount which shall be payable out of the consolidated revenue for the endowment of municipalities in such year shall be Four hundred and five thousand pounds instead of Four hundred and fifty thousand pounds as provided in sections eighty-one and eighty-two of the *Local Government Act 1891*.

(2) During the said year section eighty-two of the said Act shall be read and construed as if wherever any sum of money is specified such sum (except when the sum of One shilling is specified) were reduced in each and every case by one-tenth of such sum.
