The Parliament of Victoria enacts as follows:

1. *Purpose*

The purpose of this Act is to make new provision for the salaries and allowances of members of Parliament.

2. *Commencement*

This Act comes into operation on the day on which this Act receives the Royal Assent.

3. *Principal Act*

In this Act, the **Parliamentary Salaries and Superannuation Act 1968** is called the **Principal Act**.

4. *New Table substituted*

In section 6 of the Principal Act, for the Table substitute—
