# Parliamentary Salaries and Superannuation (Further Amendment) Act 1992

### The Parliament of Victoria enacts as follows:

### 1. Purpose

The purpose of this Act is to make new provision for the salaries and allowances of members of Parliament.

### 2. Commencement

This Act comes into operation on the day on which this Act receives the Royal Assent.
