An Act to further amend the Stamps Acts.

[20th October, 1908.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly of Victoria in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows (that is to say):—

1. This Act may be called the *Stamps Act* 1908, and shall be read and construed as one with the *Stamps Act* 1890, which Act and any Act amending the same and this Act may be cited together as the *Stamps Acts*.

Short title construction and citation. No. 1140.

2. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the *Stamps Acts* no stamp duty shall be charged or paid on any bills of exchange of any kind whatsoever drawn in Victoria and payable at any place beyond the limits of the Commonwealth of Australia, or on any bills of exchange payable in Victoria and drawn at any place beyond the limits of the Commonwealth or on any bills of exchange of any kind whatsoever drawn in Victoria and payable in any other State of the Commonwealth or any bills of exchange drawn in any State of the Commonwealth except Victoria and payable in Victoria.

Exemption from duty of bills of exchange to or from outside the Commonwealth.
