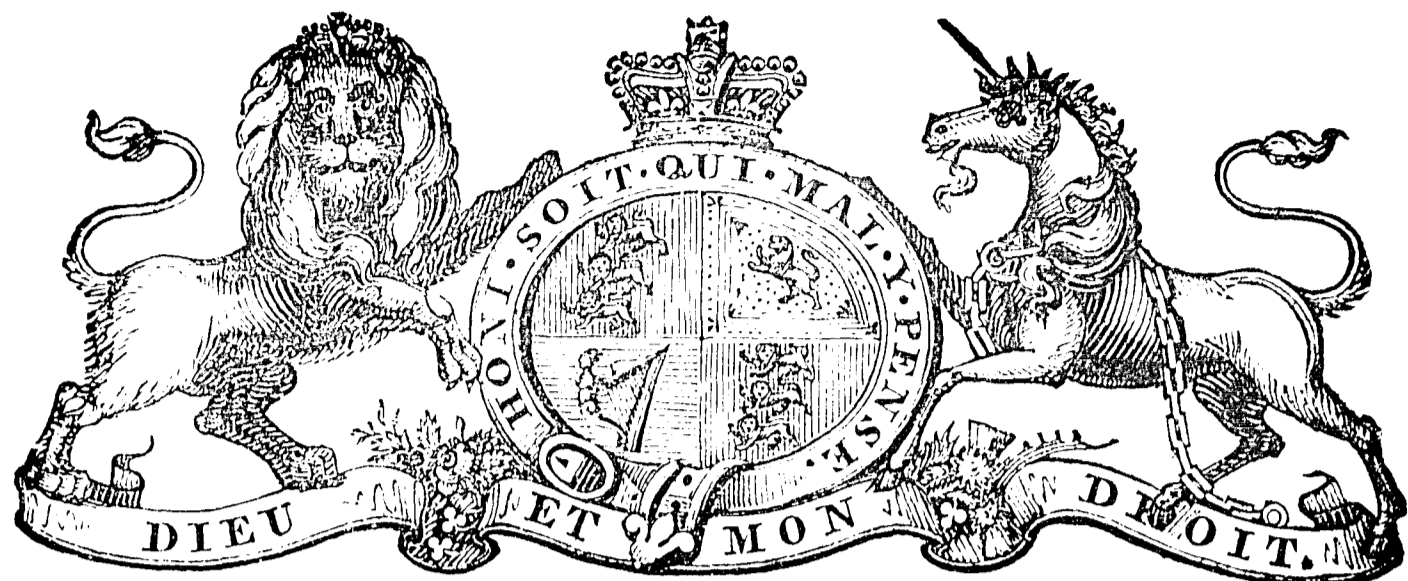

An Act to amend an Act intituled "*An Act to make better provision for the Office of Agent-General.*"

[12th December 1884.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly of Victoria in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows (that is to say) :—

1. This Act may for all purposes be cited as "*The Agent-General's Act 1884,*" and shall take effect from and after the first day July One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four.

Short title.

2. The words "two thousand" in section three of the "*Agent-General's Act 1872*" are hereby repealed, and the words "two thousand five hundred" shall be substituted in the said section in lieu of the said repealed words and the said section shall be read accordingly.
