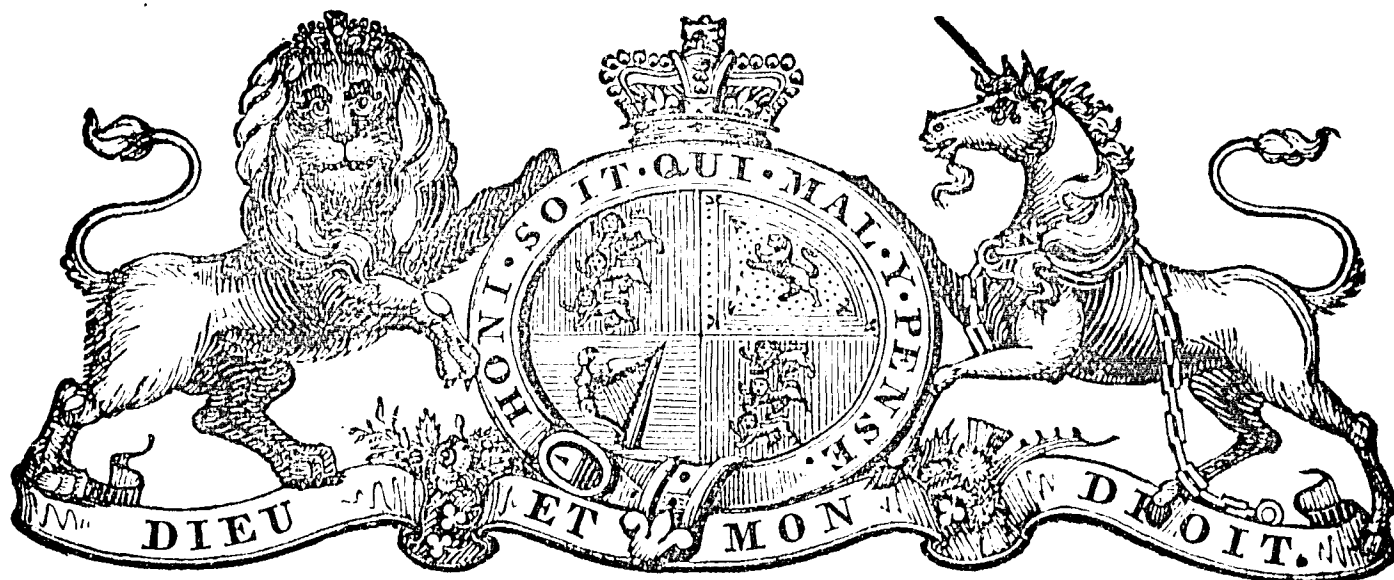

An Act to further amend "*The Companies Statute 1864.*"

[12th *December* 1884.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly of Victoria in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows (that is to say) :—

Short title.

1. This Act shall be known and cited as "*The Amending Companies Statute 1884*" and shall be deemed to be incorporated with and construed as part of "*The Companies Statute 1864.*"

Power of companies to change name.

2. Any company registered under "*The Companies Statute 1864*" with the sanction of a special resolution of the company and with the approval of the Governor in Council may change its name, and upon such change being made the Registrar-General shall enter the new name on the Register in the place of the former name and shall issue a certificate of Incorporation altered to meet the circumstances of the case, but no such alteration of name shall affect any rights or obligations of the company or render defective any legal proceedings instituted or to be instituted by or against the company, and any legal proceedings may be continued or commenced against the company by its new name that might have been continued or commenced against the company by its former name.
