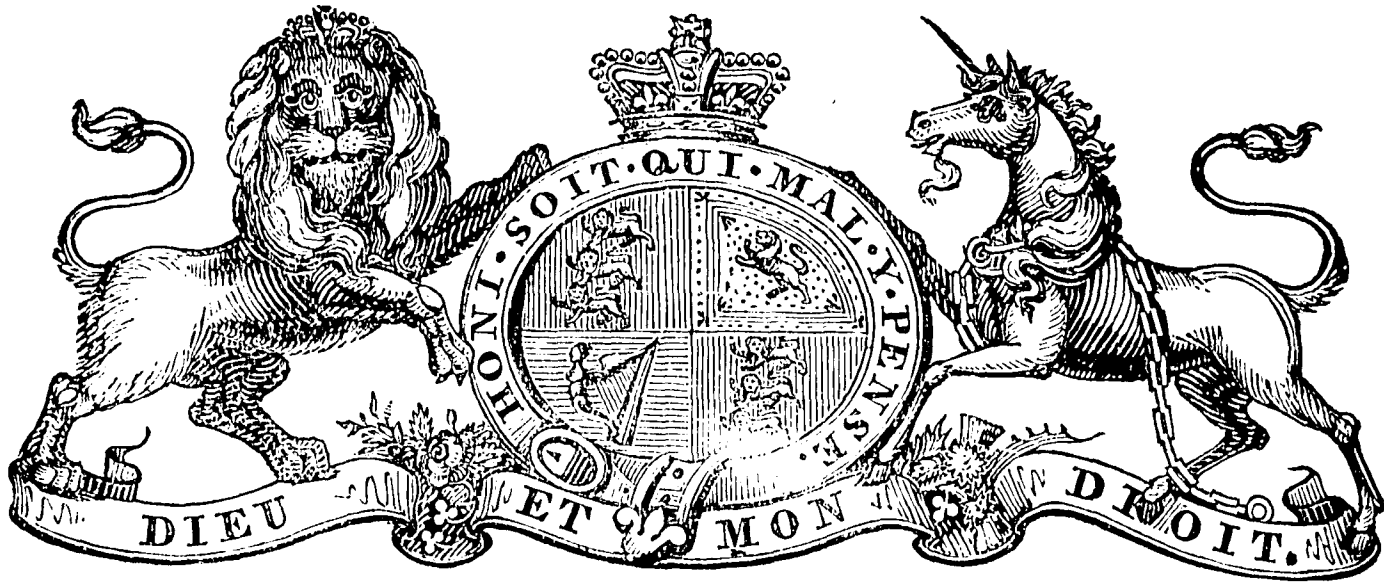

An Act to continue various Expiring Laws.  
[17th December 1888.]

**W**HEREAS the several Acts mentioned in column one of the Schedule to this Act will expire at the end of this present session of Parliament: And whereas it is expedient to provide for the continuance of the said Acts and of any enactments amending the same: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly of Victoria in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows (that is to say) :—

Preamble.

1. This Act may for all purposes be cited as "*The Expiring Laws Continuance Act 1888.*"

Short title.

2. The Acts mentioned in column one of the Schedule to this Act shall be and the same are hereby continued in full force and effect until the end of the next session of Parliament, and any enactment mentioned in column two of the said Schedule amending or affecting any enactment continued by this Act shall be continued in like manner.
