BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:-

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Sheep Act 1878 Amend-Short Title. ment Act, 1883."

If any Inspector shall be satisfied that any sheep are infected, Inspector shall give 10 it shall be lawful for him to give the owner of such sheep an order in scabby sheep to writing directing him effectually to clean such sheep within six clean, and owner, on months from the date of such order; and if at any time during such conviction for not cleaning same, liable period of six months such owner shall not have made or be making to penalties. reasonable exertions to clean such sheep, or if at the expiration of 15 three months next following such period of six months such sheep shall still be infected sheep, the owner thereof shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty of not less than pence, nor exceeding one shilling, for every such infected sheep.

If, after the expiration of six months from the date of such 20 conviction, such sheep shall still be infected sheep, such owner shall, on conviction, be liable to a further penalty of not less than pence, nor exceeding two shillings, for every such infected sheep; and

so on for every succeeding period of six months.
