negotiate a settlement. Those negotiations have taken place without success.

However, the debtor's daughter resident in the United States is anxious to avoid the

debtor's bankruptcy and may assist in negotiating a settlement.

[2] Consequently, without opposition from the creditors, the debtor now seeks an

adjournment for one month. It is anticipated that within the month the matter will

either settle or there will be significant progress towards a settlement.

[3] On that basis, therefore, I am prepared to grant a further adjournment for one

month to 30 July 2009 at 10:45 am. However, this is the second adjournment. It is

most unlikely any further adjournment will be granted and in particular I doubt

whether further adjournments will be granted unless there is every likelihood that the

matter will be settled shortly after 30 July 2009.

[4] I direct that the matter be listed for hearing at 10:45 am on 30 July 2009. It

would appear that there is every likelihood time will be available to deal with this

matter, even if it is opposed, on 30 July 2009.
