DECISION

These applications are in respect of converted club licences and seek on renewal to vary licence conditions and extend the trading hours of the premises.

The applications were duly advertised and no objections or notices of desire to be heard have been received. Accordingly we deal with the matters on the papers without public hearing pursuant to s.106(1).

In some instances the days and hours approved have been rationalised:-

- (a) to avoid trading hours being authorised for indeterminate days or
- (b) to incorporate hours previously authorised in converted licences by "special permits" or the former "standard additional conditions".

Having regard to the requirements of ss.59 and 60(4) of the Act, the hours authorised for Invercargill Squash Rackets Club are less than those sought. They are not, however, inconsistent with hours granted to other clubs of a like nature having similar objects and activities.

In all other respects we are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.68 of the Act. We renew the licences for a period of three years from the date of expiry of the current licences, and authorise the issue of club licences pursuant to s.53 of the Act in replacement of the converted licences. Copies of the new licences setting out the conditions to which each is subject are attached to this decision.

The applicants' attention is drawn to s.70 of the Act obliging the holders of club licences to display a copy of the licence, and of the conditions of the licence, attached to the interior of the premises so as to be easily read by persons using the premises.
