DECISION

This is an application by N Patel & J Patel Co Limited for an off-licence in respect of premises situated at Maunu Road, Whangarei, known as "Everyday Foodcentre".

The premises are a grocery store in terms of s.36(1)(d)(ii).

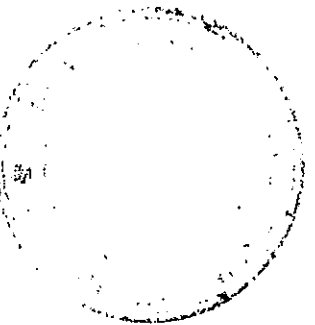
The application is the result of a change of licensee and the premises are currently operating pursuant to a temporary authority granted by the Whangarei District Licensing Agency.

The application was duly advertised and no objection or notice of desire to be heard has been received. Accordingly, we deal with the matter on the papers.

We are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.35 and we authorise the issue of an off-licence in terms of s.29 subject to the restrictions imposed by subs.(3) of s.37.

The licence may issue immediately.

The applicant's attention is drawn to s.48 of the Act obliging the holder of an off-licence to display:



1. A sign attached to the exterior of the premises, so as to be easily read by persons outside each principal entrance, stating the ordinary hours of business during which the premises will be open for the sale of liquor AND
2. A copy of the licence, and of the conditions of the licence, attached to the interior of the premises so as to be easily read by persons entering through each principal entrance.

The entrance from Maunu Road is designated as the principal entrance.

The licence will be subject to the following conditions:


- (a) No liquor shall be sold or delivered on any Sunday or on Good Friday or Christmas Day.
- (b) No liquor shall be sold other than:
 - (i) Wine that conforms to the standard prescribed by Regulation 219 or 226 of the Food Regulations 1984 (S.R. 1984/262), or any other standard that may be prescribed pursuant to the Food Act 1981 in substitution for that standard; and
 - (ii) Sparkling wine that conforms to the standard prescribed by Regulation 220 or 227 of those Regulations, or any other standard that may be prescribed pursuant to the Food Act 1981 in substitution for that standard.
- (c) Liquor may be sold or delivered only on the following days and during the following hours:

Monday to Saturday 7.00 am to 8.00 pm
- (d) The licensee shall ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale and supply of liquor to prohibited persons are observed and shall:
 - (i) Display appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory restrictions on the sale and supply of liquor to minors and the complete prohibition on sales to intoxicated persons; and
 - (ii) Have available for vendor staff forms of the kind anticipated by s.172 of the Act, enabling such staff to require customers to declare in writing that they are of the required age.

DEFINITION OF LICENSED PREMISES

In terms of Reg.10 of the Sale of Liquor Regulations 1990, the sale or delivery of liquor is authorised on or from the premises generally. The premises, located at 11 Maunu Road, Whangarei are more precisely identified in a plan submitted with the application and date stamped as received by Tribunals Division on 24 September 1992.
