DECISION

The applicants seek renewal of their licences and an extension of hours during which the sale of liquor is authorised.

The applications were duly advertised and no objections or notices of desire to be heard have been received. Accordingly we deal with the matters on the papers.

In some instances the days and hours approved have been rationalised:-

- (a) to avoid trading hours being authorised for indeterminate days or
- (b) to incorporate hours previously authorised in converted licences by "special permits" or the former "standard additional conditions".

Some clubs have requested wide ranging hours with little if any justification for the extension of hours sought. Having regard to the requirements of ss.59 and 60(4) of the Act, the hours authorised for the following clubs are less than those sought. They are not, however, inconsistent with hours granted to other clubs of a like nature having similar objects and activities:

In the case of the Ngatea Rugby Football Club the authorisation of liquor sales on indeterminate days or hours in a permanent licence would create obvious difficulties for enforcement authorities. Part IV of the Act makes specific provision for the sale of liquor at a social function or series of functions to be covered by a special licence issued by the District Licensing Agency.

In all other respects we are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.68 of the Act. We renew the licences for a period of three years from the date of expiry, and authorise the issue of replacement licences as appropriate. Copies of the new licences setting out the conditions to which each is subject are attached to this decision.

The authority conferred by this licence shall be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the club in accordance with Part VI of the Act.

### CONDITIONS

This licence is subject to the following conditions:

- (a) The club shall have a secretary at all times:
- (b) Within 10 working days of the appointment of a new secretary, the club shall inform the Secretary of the Liquor Licensing Authority of the name of the new secretary:
- (c) All proceeds from the sale of liquor shall belong to the club:
- (d) The club shall have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the club is open for the sale of liquor, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic refreshments:
- (e) Liquor may be sold only on the following days and during the following hours:

Monday to Friday	7.30 pm to 10.00 pm
Saturday	12.00 noon to 10.00 pm
Sunday	2.00 pm to 9.00 pm
- (f) Food shall be available for consumption on the premises as follows:

At all times when the premises are authorised to be open for the sale of liquor, food of a range and style similar to that shown on any menu submitted or a range of snack foods in the nature of pies, sandwiches, filled rolls, pizzas and the like, shall be conveniently available for all members and their guests and the availability of those foodstuffs shall be notified to them by appropriate notices throughout the premises.
- (g) The Club Committee shall ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale and supply of liquor to prohibited persons are observed.

### DEFINITION OF LICENSED PREMISES


In terms of Reg.13 of the Sale of Liquor Regulations 1990 the sale or supply or consumption of liquor is authorised in the premises generally.

### DURATION

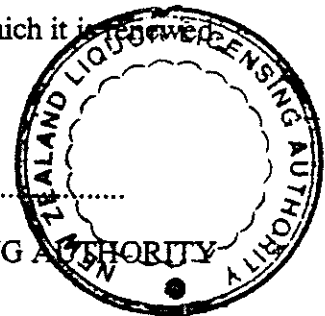
Subject to the requirements of the Act relating to the payment of fees, and to the provisions of the Act relating to the suspension and cancellation of licences, this licence shall continue in force -

- (a) Until the close of the period of 1 year commencing with the date of its issue; or
- (b) If an application for the renewal of the licence is duly made, until the application is determined; or
- (c) If the licence is renewed, until the close of the period for which it is renewed.
