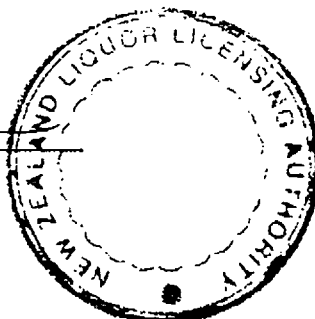
The licences may issue immediately.
