DECISION

This is an application by Levent Kavas for an on-licence in respect of premises situated at 203-205 Cuba Street, Wellington, known as "Ali Baba Turkish Restaurant". The general nature of the business to be undertaken will be that of a restaurant.

The application was duly advertised and no objection or notice of desire to be heard has been received. Accordingly we deal with the matter on the papers.

We are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.13 of the Act and we grant the applicant an on-licence authorising the sale and supply of liquor, for consumption on the premises, to any person who is present on the premises for the purpose of dining.

The licence may issue immediately.

The applicant's attention is drawn to s.25 of the Act obliging the holder of an onlicence to display:-

1. A sign attached to the exterior of the premises, so as to be easily read by persons outside each principal entrance, stating the ordinary hours of business during which the premises will be open for the sale of liquor <u>AND</u>

A copy of the licence, and of the conditions of the licence, attached to the Licenserior of the premises so as to be easily read by persons entering through each principal entrance.

The entrance from Cuba Street is designated as the principal entrance.

The licence will be subject to the following conditions:

- (a) The licensee shall have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the premises are open for the sale of liquor, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic refreshments:
- (b) Liquor may be sold only on the following days and during the following hours:

Monday to Sunday 11.00 am to 2.00 am the following day

(c) Food shall be available for consumption on the premises at all times when the premises are open for the sale of liquor in accordance with the menu submitted with the application for a licence or variations of that menu of similar range and standard.

DEFINITION OF LICENSED PREMISES

In terms of Reg. 7 of the Sale of Liquor Regulations 1990 the sale or supply or consumption of liquor is authorised in the premises generally. The premises, located at 203-205 Cuba Street, Wellington are more precisely identified in a plan submitted with the application and date stamped as received by Tribunals Division on 26 January 1994.
