DECISION

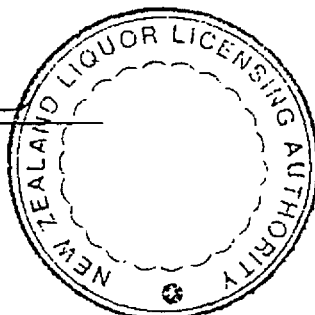
The applicant also seeks to extend the closing hour from 12.00 midnight until 1.00 am Monday to Sunday.

The application was duly advertised and no objection or notice of desire to be heard has been received. Accordingly we deal with the matter on the papers.

We are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.22 of the Act. We renew the licence until 13 October 2001, that being the anniversary date of the licence and three years from the last renewal, and authorise the issue of a replacement licence and a renewal certificate.

ON-LICENCE

(For Premises)

Sections 7 and 114, Sale of Liquor Act 1989

PURSUANT to the Sale of Liquor Act 1989, ROBERT ANTHONY MORRIS is authorised to sell and supply liquor, on the premises situated at Tongue Farm Road, Matakana, Rodney District and known as "Morris and James Cafe", for consumption on the premises, to any person who is present on the premises for the purpose of dining and to allow the consumption of liquor on the premises by any such person.

The authority conferred by this licence shall be exercised by the licensee (if an individual) or through a manager or manager appointed by the licensee in accordance with Part VI of the Act.

CONDITIONS

This licence is subject to the following conditions:

- (a) The licensee shall have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the premises are open for the sale of liquor, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic refreshments.
- (b) Liquor may be sold only on the following days and during the following hours:

Monday to Sunday 9.00 am to 1.00 am the following day
- (c) Food shall be available for consumption on the premises at all times when the premises are open for the sale of liquor in accordance with the menu submitted with the application for a licence or variations of that menu of similar range and standard.

THE LICENSED PREMISES

In terms of Regulation 7 of the Sale of Liquor Regulations 1990 the sale, supply or consumption of liquor is authorised in the premises generally. The premises located at Tongue Farm Road, Matakana, Rodney District are more precisely identified as outlined in a plan date stamped as received by Tribunals Division on 11 November 1993.

DISPLAY OF LICENCE AND PRINCIPAL ENTRANCE/S

A copy of this licence shall be displayed at the principal entrance to the premises. The entrance from Tongue Farm Road is designated as the principal entrance.

DURATION

Subject to the requirements of the Act relating to the payment of fees, and to the provisions of the Act relating to the suspension and cancellation of licences, this licence shall continue in force -

- (a) Until the close of the period of 1 year commencing with the date of its issue; or
- (b) If an application for the renewal of the licence is duly made, until the application is determined; or
- (c) If the licence is renewed, until the close of the period for which it is renewed.
