DECISION

Public notification of the application did not attract any objections or notices of desire to be heard. We deal with the matter on the papers.

The application is in respect of premises in which the principal business will be the sale of liquor. The applicant is the holder of a grape wine maker's licence number 044/GWM/899.

We are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.35 of the Act, and we grant the applicant an off-licence. A copy of the licence setting out the conditions to which it is subject is attached to this decision.

The licence may issue immediately.

The applicants' attention is drawn to s.48 of the Act obliging the holder of an off-licence to display:-

- 1. A sign attached to the exterior of the premises, so as to be readily read by persons outside each principal entrance, stating the ordinary hours of business during which the premises will be open for the sale of liquor <u>AND</u>
- 2. A copy of the licence, and of the conditions of the licence, attached to the interior of the premises so as to be easily read by persons entering through each principal entrance.

OFF-LICENCE Sections 29 and 114, Sale of Liquor Act 1989

PURSUANT to the Sale of Liquor Act 1989, <u>MURDOCH JAMES ESTATE LIMITED</u> is authorised to sell or deliver liquor or or from the premises situated at Dry River Road, Martinborough, and known as "Murdoch James Estate", to any person for consumption off the premises.

The authority conferred by this licence shall be exercised by the licensee (if an individual) or through a manager or manage appointed by the licensee in accordance with Part VI of the Act.

CONDITIONS

This licence is subject to the following conditions:

- (a) No liquor shall be sold or delivered on Good Friday or Christmas Day.
- (b) No liquor other than grape wine made on the premises pursuant to the licence under the Wine Makers Act 1981, sha be sold or delivered on any Sunday.
- (c) Liquor may be sold or delivered only on the following days and during the following hours:

Monday to Sunday 9.00 am to 12.00 midnight

- (d) The licensee shall ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale and supply of liquor to prohibited persons are observed and shall:
 - (i) Display appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory restrictions on the sale and supply of liquor to minors and the complete prohibition on sales to intoxicated persons; and
 - (ii) Have available for vendor staff forms of the kind anticipated by s.172 of the Act, enabling such staff to require customers to declare in writing that they are of the required age.

THE LICENSED PREMISES

In terms of Regulation 10 of the Sale of Liquor Regulations 1990 the sale or delivery of liquor is authorised in or from the premises generally. The premises located at Dry River Road, Martinborough are more precisely identified as outlined in a plan date stamped as received by the Liquor Licensing Authority on 14 June 1999.

DISPLAY OF LICENCE AND PRINCIPAL ENTRANCE/S

A copy of this licence shall be displayed at the principal entrance to the premises. The entrance into the tasting room is designated as the principal entrance.

DURATION

Subject to the requirements of the Act relating to the payment of fees, and to the provisions of the Act relating to the suspension and cancellation of licences, this licence shall continue in force -

- (a) Until the close of the period of 1 year commencing with the date of its issue; or
- (b) If an application for the renewal of the licence is duly made, until the application is determined; or
- (c) If the licence is renewed, until the close of the period for which it is renewed.
