

IN THE MATTER of the Sale of Liquor Act 1989

AND

IN THE MATTER of an application by AVALON RUGBY FOOTBALL CLUB INCORPORATED for a club licence pursuant to s.53 of the Act in respect of premises situated at Fraser Park, Percy Cameron Street, Lower Hutt, known as "Avalon Rugby Football Club"

DECISION

Public notification of the application attracted one objection from a resident of Lower Hutt querying the span of hours sought by the applicant club.

The letter of objection gave a contact address but neither the applicant nor our Secretary has been able to locate the objector.

A club licence was previously held in respect of these premises by the Avalon Sports Association Inc. That licence has expired and the Association no longer exists.

The sporting bodies (softball, darts, touch rugby and cricket) that were part of the former club are now affiliated to the rugby club.

We are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.59 of the Act and we grant the applicant a club licence. A copy of the licence setting out the conditions to which it is subject is attached to this decision.

The AVALON RUGBY FOOTBALL CLUB INCORPORATED, is authorised to sell and supply liquor, on the premises situated at Fraser Park, Percy Cameron Street, Lower Hutt, and known as "Avalon Rugby Football Club", for consumption on the premises, to-

- (a) Any member of the club; or
- (b) Any person who is a guest of, and is accompanied by, a member of the club; or
- (c) Any member of any other club with which the holder of the licence has an arrangement for reciprocal visiting rights for members of the clubs.

The authority conferred by this licence shall be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the club in accordance with Part VI of the Act.

CONDITIONS

This licence is subject to the following conditions:

- (a) The club shall have a secretary at all times:
- (b) Within 10 working days of the appointment of a new secretary, the club shall inform the Secretary of the Liquor Licensing Authority of the name of the new secretary:
- (c) All proceeds from the sale of liquor shall belong to the club:
- (d) The club shall have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the club is open for the sale of liquor a reasonable range of non-alcoholic refreshments:
- (e) Liquor may be sold only on the following days and during the following hours:

Monday to Thursday	12.00 noon to 11.00 pm
Friday, Saturday and Public Holidays	12.00 noon to 12.00 midnight
Sunday	12.00 noon to 10.00 pm
- (f) Food shall be available for consumption on the premises as follows:

At all times when the premises are authorised to be open for the sale of liquor, food of a range and style similar to that shown on any menu submitted or a range of snack foods in the nature of pies, sandwiches, filled rolls, pizzas and the like, shall be conveniently available for all members and their guests and the availability of those foodstuffs shall be notified to them by appropriate notices throughout the premises.
- (g) The Club Committee shall ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale and supply of liquor to prohibited persons are observed.

THE LICENSED PREMISES

In terms of Reg.13 of the Sale of Liquor Regulations 1990 the sale or supply or consumption of liquor is authorised in the premises generally. The premises located at Fraser Park, Percy Cameron Street, Lower Hutt are more precisely identified as outlined in a plan date stamped as received by Tribunals Division on 16 February 1999.

DISPLAY OF LICENCE


A copy of this licence shall be displayed in the interior of the premises so as to be easily read by persons using the premises

DURATION

Subject to the requirements of the Act relating to the payment of fees, and to the provisions of the Act relating to the suspension and cancellation of licences, this licence shall continue in force -

- (a) Until the close of the period of 1 year commencing with the date of its issue; or
- (b) If an application for the renewal of the licence is duly made, until the application is determined; or
- (c) If the licence is renewed, until the close of the period for which it is renewed.
