DECISION

The general nature of the business undertaken is that of a restaurant.


We are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.13 of the Act, and we grant the applicant an on-licence. A copy of the licence setting out the conditions to which it is subject is attached to this decision.

The licence may issue immediately.

The applicant's attention is drawn to s.25 of the Act obliging the holder of an onlicence to display:-

- 1. A sign attached to the exterior of the premises, so as to be easily read by persons outside each principal entrance, stating the ordinary hours of business during which the premises will be open for the sale of liquor <u>AND</u>
- 2. A copy of the licence, and of the conditions of the licence, attached to the interior of the premises so as to be easily ready by persons entering through each principal entrance.

ON-LICENCE

(For Premises) Sections 7 and 114, Sale of Liquor Act 1989

PURSUANT to the Sale of Liquor Act 1989, the partnership of <u>KANUBHAI HIRABHAI PATEL and</u> <u>JYOTSNABEN BHIKHABHAI PATEL</u> ("the licensee") is authorised to sell and supply liquor, on the premises situated at 15 Kent Terrace, Wellington and known as "Chariot", for consumption on the premises, to any person who is present on the premises for the purpose of dining and to allow the consumption of liquor on the premises by any such person.

The authority conferred by this licence shall be exercised by the licensee (if an individual) or through a manager or managers appointed by the licensee in accordance with Part VI of the Act.

CONDITIONS

This licence is subject to the following conditions:

- (a) The licensee shall have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the premises are open for the sale of liquor, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic refreshments.
- (b) Liquor may be sold only on the following days and during the following hours:

Monday to Sunday 7.00 am to 1.00 am the following day

(c) Food shall be available for consumption on the premises at all times when the premises are open for the sale of liquor in accordance with the menu submitted with the application for a licence or variations of that menu of similar range and standard.

THE LICENSED PREMISES

In terms of Regulation 7 of the Sale of Liquor Regulations 1990 the sale, supply or consumption of liquor is authorised in the premises generally. The premises located at 15 Kent Terrace, Wellington are more precisel identified as outlined in a plan date stamped as received by the Liquor Licensing Authority on 2 February 2001

DISPLAY OF LICENCE AND PRINCIPAL ENTRANCE

A copy of this licence shall be displayed at the principal entrance to the premises. The entrance from Kent Terrace is designated as the principal entrance.

DURATION

Subject to the requirements of the Act relating to the payment of fees, and to the provisions of the Act relating to the suspension and cancellation of licences, this licence shall continue in force -

- (a) Until the close of the period of 1 year commencing with the date of its issue; or
- (b) If an application for the renewal of the licence is duly made, until the application is determined; or
- (c) If the licence is renewed, until the close of the period for which it is renewed.
