DECISION

This is an application by Courtenay Place (No 68) Limited for renewal of an on-licence in respect of premises situated at First Floor, Victory Building, 68 Courtenay Place, Wellington, known as "Ballroom Billiard Saloon".

In addition to the renewal of the on-licence the applicant also seeks to increase the hours of trading on Sundays by amending the closing time of 12.00 midnight to 3.00 am the following day. In all other respects the conditions of the licence remain unaltered.

The application was duly advertised and no objection or notice of desire to be heard has been received. Accordingly we deal with the matter on the papers.

We are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.22 of the Act. We renew the licence until 7 December 2002, that being the anniversary date of the licence and three years from the last renewal and authorise the issue of a replacement licence and a renewal certificate.

ON-LICENCE

Sections 7 and 114, Sale of Liquor Act 1989

PURSUANT to the Sale of Liquor Act 1989, **COURTENAY PLACE (NO 68) LIMITED** is authorised to sell and supply liquor on the premises situated at First Floor, Victory Building, 68 Courtenay Place, Wellington and known as "Ballroom Billiard Saloon", for consumption on the premises to **any person who is present on the premises** and to allow the consumption of liquor on the premises by any such person.

The authority conferred by this licence must be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the licensee in accordance with Part VI of the Act.

CONDITIONS

This licence is subject to the following conditions:

- (a) The licensee must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the premises are open for the sale of liquor, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic and low-alcohol refreshments.
- (b) Liquor may be sold only on the following days and during the following hours:
**On such days and during such hours as facilities are provided for the playing of indoor sports such as pool, billiards and snooker but not other than:
Monday to Sunday 11.00 am to 3.00 am the following day.**
- (c) Food must be available for consumption on the premises as follows:
At all times when the premises are authorised to be open for the sale of liquor, food of a range and style similar to that shown on any menu submitted or a range of snack foods in the nature of pies, sandwiches, filled rolls, pizzas and the like, must be conveniently available for all patrons and the availability of those foodstuffs must be notified to them by appropriate notices throughout the premises.
- (d) The licensee must ensure that signs are prominently displayed within the licensed premises detailing information regarding alternative forms of transport from the premises.
- (e) The licensee must implement and maintain the steps proposed in the application for the licence aimed at promoting the responsible consumption of liquor.
- (f) The licensee must ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale and supply of liquor to prohibited persons are observed and must display appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of liquor to minors and the complete prohibition on sales to intoxicated persons.

THE LICENSED PREMISES

In terms of Regulation 7 of the Sale of Liquor Regulations 1990 the sale, supply or consumption of liquor is authorised in the first floor of the premises only. The premises situated at 68 Courtenay Place, Wellington are more precisely identified as outlined in a plan date stamped as received by Tribunals Division on 30 May 1996.

DISPLAY OF LICENCE AND PRINCIPAL ENTRANCE/S


A copy of this licence must be displayed at the principal entrance to the premises. The entrance from the stairway from Courtenay Place is designated as the principal entrance.

DURATION

Subject to the requirements of the Act relating to the payment of fees, and to the provisions of the Act relating to the suspension and cancellation of licences, this licence continues in force -

- (a) Until the close of the period of 1 year commencing with the date of its issue; or
- (b) If an application for the renewal of the licence is duly made, until the application is determined; or
- (c) If the licence is renewed, until the close of the period for which it is renewed.
