DECISION

This is an application by G.R. Skinner Limited for renewal of an on-licence in respect of premises situated at Havelock Road, Havelock North, Hastings, known as "Happy Tav".

In addition to the renewal of the licences the applicant also seeks, pursuant to Regulation 7(3) of the Sale of Liquor Regulations 1990, to increase the area in which liquor may be sold and consumed by the inclusion of an outdoor area previously occupied by a volleyball court. Favourable reports have been received from the Police and District Licensing Agency.

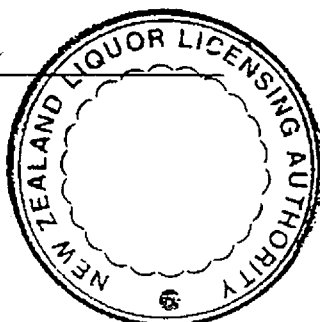
The application was duly advertised and no objection or notice of desire to be heard has been received. Accordingly we deal with the matter on the papers.

We are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.22 of the Act and Reg.7 of the Regulations. We renew the licence until 31 October 2002, that being the anniversary date of the licence and three years from the last renewal and authorise the issue of a replacement licence (which including the outdoor area) and a renewal certificate.

ON-LICENCE

Sections 7 and 114, Sale of Liquor Act 1989

PURSUANT to the Sale of Liquor Act 1989, G.R. SKINNER LIMITED is authorised to sell and supply liquor on the premises situated at Havelock Road, Havelock North, Hastings and known as "Happy Tav", for consumption on the premises to any person who is present on the premises and to allow the consumption of liquor on the premises by any such person.

The authority conferred by this licence must be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the licensee in accordance with Part VI of the Act.

CONDITIONS

This licence is subject to the following conditions:

- (a) The licensee must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the premises are open for the sale of liquor, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic and low-alcohol refreshments.
- (b) No liquor is to be sold or supplied on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day or before 1.00 pm on ANZAC Day to any person other than persons who are present on the premises for the purpose of dining.
- (c) Liquor may be sold only on the following days and during the following hours:
 - (i) **Chats Bar:**
Monday to Saturday 7.00 am to 3.00 am the following day; and Sunday 7.00 am to 1.30 am the following day (7.00 am to 12.00 midnight on the Thursday before Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Christmas Eve, and the day before ANZAC Day).
 - (ii) **The remainder of the premises including the outdoor area:**
Monday to Saturday 7.00 am to 2.00 am the following day; and Sunday 7.00 am to 1.30 am the following day (7.00 am to 12.00 midnight on the Thursday before Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Christmas Eve, and the day before ANZAC Day).
- (d) Food must be available for consumption on the premises as follows:
At all times when the premises are authorised to be open for the sale of liquor, food of a range and style similar to that shown on any menu submitted or a range of snack foods in the nature of pies, sandwiches, filled rolls, pizzas and the like, must be conveniently available for all patrons and the availability of those foodstuffs must be notified to them by appropriate notices throughout the premises.
- (e) **Each of the following parts of the premises is designated as a supervised area: Every bar.**
- (f) The licensee must ensure that signs are prominently displayed within the licensed premises detailing information regarding alternative forms of transport from the premises.
- (g) The licensee must implement and maintain the steps proposed in the application for the licence aimed at promoting the responsible consumption of liquor.
- (h) The licensee must ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale and supply of liquor to prohibited persons are observed and must display appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of liquor to minors and the complete prohibition on sales to intoxicated persons.

THE LICENSED PREMISES

In terms of Regulation 7 of the Sale of Liquor Regulations 1990 the sale, supply or consumption of liquor is authorised in the premises generally including the outdoor area. The premises situated at Havelock Road, Havelock North are more precisely identified as outlined in a plan date stamped as received by the Liquor Licensing Authority on 17 December 1999.

DISPLAY OF LICENCE AND PRINCIPAL ENTRANCE/S


A copy of this licence must be displayed at the principal entrance to the premises. The entrances from Te Aute Road and the carpark are designated as the principal entrances.

DURATION

Subject to the requirements of the Act relating to the payment of fees, and to the provisions of the Act relating to the suspension and cancellation of licences, this licence continues in force -

- (a) Until the close of the period of 1 year commencing with the date of its issue; or
- (b) If an application for the renewal of the licence is duly made, until the application is determined; or
- (c) If the licence is renewed, until the close of the period for which it is renewed.
