An Act to appropriate and apply certain Sums of Money out of Title. the Consolidated Fund, the Public Works Fund, and other Accounts to the Services of the Year ending the Thirty-first Day of March, One thousand nine hundred and four, and to appropriate the Supplies granted in this Present Session.

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,—We, Your Majesty's most Address. dutiful and loyal subjects, the House of Representatives of New Zealand, in Parliament assembled, towards making good the supply which we have cheerfully granted to Your Majesty in this session of Parliament, have resolved to grant unto Your Majesty the sums hereinafter mentioned, and do therefore most humbly beseech Your Majesty that it may be enacted: And be it enacted by the General Assembly of New Zealand in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Appropriation Act, short Title. 1903."
- 2. The Colonial Treasurer may issue and apply out of the Con- Grant of £1,171,548, solidated Fund, towards making good the supplies granted to His and fees, out of Consolidated Fund.

Majesty for the services of the year ending on the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and four, any sums not exceeding in the whole the sum of one million one hundred and seventy-one thousand five hundred and forty-eight pounds, together with the amount of the fees hereinafter mentioned.

Appropriation of £3,824,083, and fees, out of Consolidated Fund.

3. All sums granted as aforesaid out of the Consolidated Fund by this Act, together with the sums granted out of that fund by the other Acts mentioned in First Schedule hereto, amounting in the whole to three million eight hundred and twenty-four thousand and eighty-three pounds, as appears by the said Schedule, together with the fees collected by such public officers as are authorised to retain the same in lieu of salary, are hereby appropriated for the several services and purposes expressed in the several votes specified in the Abstract in the said First Schedule.

Grant of £582,608 out of Public Works Fund. 4. The Colonial Treasurer may issue and apply out of the Public Works Fund, towards making good the supplies granted to His Majesty for the works and services of the year ending as aforesaid, any sums not exceeding in the whole the sum of five hundred and eighty-two thousand six hundred and eight pounds.

Appropriation of £1,777,465 out of Public Works Fund.

5. All sums granted as aforesaid out of the Public Works Fund by this Act, together with the sums granted out of that fund by the other Acts mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto, amounting in the whole one million seven hundred and seventy-seven thousand four hundred and sixty-five pounds, as appears by the said Second Schedule, are hereby appropriated for the several works and services expressed in the several votes specified in the Abstract in the said Second Schedule.

Grant of £132,589 out of separate accounts.

6. Out of the respective accounts mentioned in the Abstract in the Third Schedule hereto the Colonial Treasurer may issue and apply, towards making good the supplies granted to His Majesty for the services of the year ending as aforesaid, any sums not exceeding in the whole the sum of one hundred and thirty-two thousand five hundred and eighty-nine pounds.

Appropriation of £344,856 out of separate accounts.

7. All sums granted as aforesaid out of the said respective accounts by this Act, together with the sums granted out of those accounts by the other Acts mentioned in the said Third Schedule hereto, amounting in the whole to three hundred and forty-four thousand eight hundred and fifty-six pounds, as appears by the said Schedule, are hereby appropriated for the respective services and purposes expressed in the several votes specified in the Abstract in the said Third Schedule.

Authority to pay moneys under agreements validated by "The Auckland Goldfields Proclamations Validation Act, 1869."

8. The Colonial Treasurer may issue and pay out of the Consolidated Fund all moneys lawfully payable to any Natives under and by virtue of the agreements validated by "The Auckland Goldfields Proclamations Validation Act, 1869," or to any persons lawfully entitled to the lands from which the revenues accrue in virtue of any such agreement.

Subsidies to be paid to local bodies.

9. (1.) There shall be issued and paid by the Colonial Treasurer out of the Consolidated Fund to the Council or Board of each county, road district, and town district, in respect of the general rates described in the Schedule to "The Local Bodies' Finance and Powers Act, 1885" (in this section referred to as "the said

- Act"), levied for the year ending as aforesaid, and actually collected on or before the thirtieth day of June ensuing next after the said thirty-first day of March, one-fourth of the amounts to which they would be entitled under the plan of distribution described in the Schedule to the said Act.
- (2.) Upon the application of the local body, setting forth the amount of general rates collectible for the year ending the said thirty-first day of March, and showing separately how much thereof is in respect of Native lands, seventy-five per centum, and no more, of the amount which it is estimated by the Commissioner of Taxes may become payable to such local body for rates other than rates on Native lands may be advanced to such local body within that
- (3.) On receipt by the Commissioner of Taxes of returns, duly verified by the declaration of the Chairman or Treasurer of a local body, showing the amount of the rates aforesaid actually collected to the said thirtieth day of June, the amount of subsidy found to be payable in respect of such rates, less the amount (if any) advanced as aforesaid, shall be paid to such local body; and any sum advanced in excess of the amount so found to be payable shall be repaid by the local body to the Public Account, or be recovered by the Colonial Treasurer out of any moneys payable to such local body.
- (4.) Where a local body has adopted "The Rating on Unimproved Value Act, 1896," no subsidy shall be payable on any amount exceeding the sum which would be recoverable on a rate of three farthings in the pound on the capital or gross value of the rateable property in its district.

(5.) The provisions of the first paragraph of the Schedule to the said Act, and of the last preceding subsection hereof, shall apply to subsidies payable to Borough Councils under "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1900."

- (6.) In case any doubt arises as to the several payments to be made under this section, or as to payments to be made in respect of newly formed districts wherein the local body has not had sufficient time to levy and collect rates, the Governor in Council may decide the amounts of such payments, and his decision shall be final.
- 10. (1.) The Colonial Treasurer is hereby authorised to issue Authority to make and pay out of the Consolidated Fund, by way of temporary temporary advance to local governing advance, any sum or sums, not exceeding in the whole the sum bodies. of one thousand pounds, for the purpose of defraying any charges or expenses incurred by or on behalf of any local governing body.

(2.) All such advances shall be repaid to the Consolidated Fund out of the first moneys thereafter accruing to such local governing body, and may be deducted or recovered by the Colonial Treasurer accordingly.

(3.) For the purposes of this section the expression "local governing body" means a County Council, Borough Council, Town Board, Road Board, River Board, Harbour Board, and an Education Board, and includes any other body or persons, however desig-

nated, to whom any moneys are payable out of the Consolidated Fund.

Appropriation.

Power to make contracts in excess of appropriation. 11. It shall be lawful for the Governor, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty the King, to enter into any contracts, or to incur any liabilities, for carrying on the works and services for which money is appropriated by this Act: Provided that in the case of the works and services specified in the Fourth Schedule hereto the amount of liability thereby incurred shall not, together with the sum appropriated therefor, exceed the sum set down in the ninth column in that Schedule opposite to each such work or service.

Power to pay over to local governing bodies. 12. Out of the moneys appropriated by this Act for the construction of public roads, and such other public works as are usually constructed by or are under the control of local governing bodies, sums may be paid over to such local governing body or bodies as the Minister in charge of the department in connection with which such roads or works are constructed determines, to such amounts and upon such terms and conditions as such Minister prescribes, to be expended by such body upon any of the works or services for which the same are appropriated by this Act; and the Colonial Treasurer shall make all such payments accordingly.

Money appropriated for roads, &c., defined.

13. (1.) The moneys appropriated by this Act out of the Public Works Fund or the Loans to Local Bodies Account for the construction or improvement of railways, roads, bridges, buildings, and other public works shall be available for all or any of the following purposes:—

(a.) The construction of railways, and the construction and repair of roads, drains, buildings, bridges, jetties, and

wharves:

(b.) The protection of and improvement of the navigation of rivers and lakes;

(c.) The acquisition of land;

(d.) The payment of salaries, allowances, and travelling-expenses, and the wages of workers;

(e.) The purchase of material and provisions;

(f.) The purchase of furniture and fittings for public buildings, and the payment of wages and purchase of furniture, provisions, and other necessaries for the maintenance of sanatoria and other establishments for which money is appropriated;

(g.) The purchase of tools, plant, provisions, clothing, and other requisites connected with the employment of labour, and whether or not the same are to be used for the benefit of or sold or lent to workers employed on public works;

(h.) The payment of fares and freights by land or sea in respect of the transit of such workers, their families and effects, to or from their work;

(i.) The cost of any material or stores required for the effectual carrying-out of any of the aforesaid works or purposes;

(j.) The payment of compensation and costs payable under "The Workers' Compensation for Accidents Act, 1900," in respect of injuries to workers employed on any of the aforesaid works.

(2.) The cost of tools, plant, provisions, clothing, or other requisites sold or lent to workers as aforesaid may be deducted from time to time in one or more sums of money from the money earned, whether by day-labour or by co-operative contract, by the person to whom the same are sold or lent.

14. Whereas under "The Lands Improvement and Native Lands Advances under Acquisition Act, 1894," the Colonial Treasurer is authorised to make advances to settlers for improving their lands: Be it enacted that all Native Lands such advances and the expenses connected therewith, whether such Acquisition Act, 1894," authorised. advances are made directly to any member of an association or expended by or under the directions of the Minister of Lands, may be paid out of the vote taken in Class XXXVI., Public Works Fund,

for improved-farm settlements.

15. (1.) Whenever it becomes necessary that money should be Power to pay money expended on account of the Government Insurance Department, the in excess of appropriation out of Public Trust Office, or the Government Advances to Settlers Office, certain accounts. in excess of or without the appropriation of Parliament, the Government Insurance Commissioner, the Public Trustee, or the Superintendent, as the case may be, may, with the sanction of the Colonial Treasurer, but not otherwise, pay such money in excess of or without the appropriation of Parliament.

(2.) All such expenditure shall be charged to the Unauthorised

16. made default in so doing, he may pay the same, and may cause the amount so paid to be recovered from the defaulting local authority as a debt due to the Crown, or to be deducted from any subsidy or other moneys at any time payable by the Government to such local authority.

Authority to arrange with Imperial Government.

20. The Colonial Treasurer is hereby empowered to make arrangements with the Imperial Government or other authority, civil or military, on behalf of the colony, for the payment of all or any of the expenses incidental to or arising out of the equipping and maintaining the contingents of mounted infantry raised for service in South Africa, including the costs of embarkation and transport to and from South Africa.

Public Trustee may purchase new premises.

21. The Public Trustee, with the sanction of the Trust Office Board, may, notwithstanding anything contained in section thirtyseven of "The Public Trust Office Consolidation Act, 1894," or any Act, out of any balance to the credit of the Profit and Loss Account, apply any sum not exceeding fifteen thousand pounds in the purchase of land with buildings thereon, and in any alterations thereto, or in the purchase of land and the erection of buildings thereon, in the City of Wellington, and in providing office accommodation and furniture for the purpose of carrying on the business of the Public Trust Office.

Purchase of silver and bronze coin.

22. The Colonial Treasurer is hereby authorised to arrange with any or all of the banking institutions doing business in this colony for the purchase on their behalf (including the expenses incidental thereto), without further appropriation than this Act, of silver and bronze coin from the Royal Mint in London, or from any branch thereof in Australia, to an amount not exceeding one hundred thousand pounds.

Expenses of Maori land administra-

23. Notwithstanding any provision in "The Maori Lands Administration Act, 1900," to the contrary, the Minister may, out of any moneys appropriated by Parliament for the purpose, defray the costs of administration of the said Act.

This section shall, in the case of each Council, remain in operation until the Council has accumulated a fund sufficient to enable it to comply with the provisions of section forty-three of the said Act, but not in any case after the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and five.
