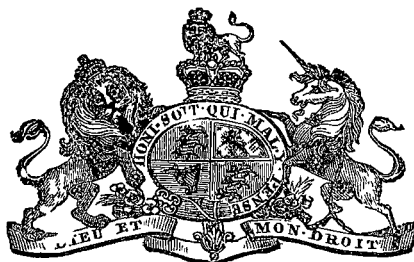

AN ACT to amend "The Financial Arrangements Act, 1876." Title.
[14th September, 1885.]

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Financial Arrangements Act 1876 Amendment Act, 1885." Short Title.

2. All fines and penalties for offences punishable under "The Harbours Act, 1878," and the several Acts amending the same, or for breaches of by-laws made by any Harbour Board, shall be paid to the Harbour Board having control or jurisdiction over the harbour at the place where such offences shall respectively be committed, or for the breach of whose by-laws such fines or penalties shall respectively be inflicted. Fines for offences and breach of by-laws to be paid to Harbour Board.

3. All moneys which shall become payable to any Harbour Board under the provisions of this Act shall be deemed to form part of the Harbour Fund of such Board, as defined by section one hundred and seventy-one of "The Harbours Act, 1878," and shall be applied and disposed of as part of such fund in manner provided by such last-mentioned Act or any subsisting statutory modification thereof.
