AN ACT to enable Local Bodies to appoint Assessors to the Assessment Court constituted under "The Government Valuation of Land Act Amendment Act, 1900."

Title.

[20th October, 1906.]

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Government Valuation of Land Act Amendment Act, 1906"; and it shall form part of and be read together with "The Government Valuation of Land Act Amendment Act, 1900" (hereinafter called "the principal Act").

Short Title.

2. Subsection three of section fifteen of the principal Act is hereby repealed, and the following inserted in lieu thereof:—

Local authorities to be represented on the Assessment Court.

"(3.) Of the other two members of the Court, one member shall be appointed by the Governor in Council and the other member by the local authority of the district whose roll has been revised; provided that such last-mentioned member shall not be a member of any local authority."

3. For the purposes of the last preceding section, "local authority" shall be deemed to mean in every borough the Borough Council, in every town district the Town Board, in every road district the Road Board, and in every county outside road and town districts the County Council:

Interpretation of meaning of "local authority."

Provided that two or more local authorities may join for the purpose of appointing an Assessor:

Provided further that if the local authority fails to appoint an Assessor, such appointment may be made by the Governor in Council.
