Title.

An Acr to Amend the Police Offences Act, 1927.

[1st December, 1950

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

- 1. This Act may be cited as the Police Offences Amendment Act, 1950, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Police Offences Act, 1927 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).
- 2. (1) Every person commits an offence who (not being a member of the crew or a passenger on the ship or a person duly authorized by law to be on the ship) refuses or fails to leave any ship when ordered so to do by the master or any officer of the ship or any constable, or, after having been so ordered to leave any ship, returns on board or persists in attempting to re-enter the ship.
- (2) Any constable may take into custody without warrant any person found committing an offence against this section.
- (3) Every person who commits an offence against this section shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding ten pounds.

(4) Section forty-three of the Statutes Amendment Repeal. Act, 1949, is hereby repealed.

3. (1) Section three of the principal Act is hereby Offence to amended by adding the following paragraph:-

discharge firearm to

"(f) Discharges any firearm without reasonable damage or cause to the damage or danger of any person or property; or discharges a fire-property. arm without reasonable cause in or on any public place or so near thereto as endanger, annoy, or frighten the passers bv."

(2) The said section three is hereby further amended by omitting from paragraph (cc) the words "Discharges any firearms without reasonable cause, or ".
