#### A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to apply a Sum of Money out of the Consolidated Fund and other  
 Moneys to the Service of the Year ending the Thirty-first day of March,  
 One thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, and to appropriate the  
 Supplies granted in this present Session.

5 MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,—We, Your Majesty's most dutiful and  
 loyal subjects, the House of Representatives of New Zealand in Parliament  
 assembled, towards making good the supply which we have cheerfully granted to  
 Your Majesty in this session of Parliament, have resolved to grant unto Your  
 10 Majesty the sums hereinafter mentioned, and do therefore most humbly beseech  
 Your Majesty that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the General Assembly  
 of New Zealand in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of  
 the same, as follows :—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Appropriation Act, 1882." Short Title.

15 GRANTS OUT OF THE PUBLIC ACCOUNT.

2. The Colonial Treasurer for the time being may issue out of the Con-  
 solidated Fund, and apply towards making good the Supplies granted to Her  
 Majesty for the services of the year ending on the thirty-first day of March, one

 and fees.

thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, the sum of one million four hundred and sixty-two thousand five hundred and forty-three pounds, together with the amount of the fees hereinafter mentioned.

APPROPRIATION OF GRANTS.

3. All sums granted by this Act, and the other Acts mentioned in Schedule A annexed hereto, out of the Consolidated Fund, amounting, as appears by the said Schedule A, to two million two hundred and sixty-two thousand five hundred and forty-three pounds, together with the fees collected by such public officers as are authorized to retain the same in lieu of salary, are appropriated for the purposes and services expressed in the several votes in the Schedules B and C annexed hereto. 5

Provision for salaries,  
&c., in Insurance  
Department.

4. And whereas by the thirty-ninth section of "The Government Insurance and Annuities Act, 1874," it is enacted that the salary of the Commissioner and other officers and the other contingent expenses shall be paid out of moneys from time to time appropriated from the Government Insurance Account for the purpose by the General Assembly: Be it enacted, the said salaries and expenses for the year ending the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, shall be for the amounts set forth in the Schedule D annexed hereto, not exceeding in the whole the sum of thirty-three thousand nine hundred and ten pounds. 15

If within any financial year it becomes necessary to exceed the amounts hereby voted for the salaries of clerks, or for contingent expenses, the Government Insurance Commissioner may, with the sanction of the Colonial Treasurer, but not otherwise, pay such moneys in excess; and an account of such expenditure in excess, certified by the Controller and Auditor-General, shall be laid before Parliament within ten days after the then next meeting thereof, and the amount of such excess shall be included in the Estimates of the following year. 25

5. And whereas by the eleventh section of "The Public Trust Office Act, 1872," it is enacted that the salary of the Public Trustee and of the other officers and servants in the Public Trust Office shall be such as shall be fixed by the General Assembly: Be it enacted that the said salaries for the year ending the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, shall be for the amounts set forth in Schedule E annexed hereto, not exceeding in the whole the sum of three thousand and twenty pounds. 30

6. The Public Trustee shall pay out of the Native Reserves Account in the Public Trust Office the salaries and expenses to the amounts set forth in the Schedule F annexed hereto, not exceeding in the whole the sum of one thousand five hundred and seventy-four pounds. 35

Provision releasing  
Borough of Kumara  
from payment of  
certain moneys.

7. And whereas the Borough of Kumara has been charged with gold duty amounting to three hundred and eighty-six pounds nineteen shillings and threepence, paid in error to the said borough: And whereas the borough has repaid a portion of the said amount, and there is still a balance of three hundred and fifty-four pounds three shillings and sixpence remaining to be repaid: And whereas it is expedient that the said borough should be relieved from all liability in respect of the said balance: 40

Be it enacted:

The Mayor, Council, and Inhabitants of the Borough of Kumara, and the revenues and property of the said borough, are hereby released and discharged

from payment of the said sum of three hundred and fifty-four pounds three shillings and sixpence.

8. Anything in the ninth section of "The University Endowment Act, 1868," notwithstanding, the gross rents and profits of the endowments in the said Act referred to shall be paid into the Public Account, to the credit of the Colonial University Account; and the Colonial Treasurer shall issue and pay thereout all the necessary expenses in the said section mentioned.

Rents, &c., of endowments under "The University Endowment Act, 1868," to be paid into Public Account.

9. The Colonial Treasurer is hereby authorized to issue and pay out of the Consolidated Fund all moneys lawfully payable to any Natives under and by virtue of the agreements validated by "The Auckland Gold Fields Proclamations Validation Act, 1869," or to any persons lawfully entitled to the lands from which the revenues accrue in virtue of any such agreement.

Authority to issue moneys payable under agreements validated by "The Auckland Gold Fields Proclamations Validation Act, 1869."

10. And whereas the Colonial Treasurer has, under the authority of sections forty-four and forty-five of "The Public Revenues Act, 1878," issued during the twelve months ending the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, in excess of or without the appropriation of Parliament, the sum of fifty-five thousand nine hundred and seventeen pounds four shillings and fourpence from the Consolidated Fund, and the sum of forty-seven pounds seventeen shillings and sixpence from the Government Insurance Account, and has applied the said sums to the several purposes and services mentioned in the Schedule G hereto annexed: Be it enacted that the application of the said sum is hereby sanctioned.

Indemnity.

11. The moneys payable under this Act for roads or other public works may be paid over to such local governing bodies as the Minister for Public Works or other Minister may determine, upon such terms and conditions as shall be agreed upon between the said Public Works or other Minister and any such local governing body; and the Colonial Treasurer shall make all such payments in accordance with any such agreement.

Moneys payable for roads or other public works may be paid over to local bodies.

12. The Colonial Treasurer is hereby authorized to issue and pay out of the Consolidated Fund, by way of temporary advance, any sum or sums not exceeding one thousand pounds in the whole, for the purpose of defraying any charges or expenses incurred by or on behalf of any local governing body.

Provision for charges or expenses incurred by local governing bodies.

All such advances shall be repaid to the Consolidated Fund out of the first moneys thereafter accruing to such local governing body, and may be deducted or recovered by the Colonial Treasurer accordingly.

For the purposes of this section the expression "local governing body" means a County Council, Borough Council, Town District Board, Road Board, River Board, and an Education Board, and includes any other body or persons however designated to whom any moneys are paid or payable out of the Consolidated Fund.

13. And whereas by "The Public Revenues Act, 1881," it was provided that all moneys issued and paid under the authority thereof should be included in the estimates for the year or other period in which the same were paid, and in the accounts of such period:

Sums granted and appropriated by "The Public Revenues Act, 1881," included in this Act.

Be it enacted:

The several sums granted and appropriated by this Act shall be taken and deemed to be inclusive of and not in excess of the moneys issued and paid during the two months ended the thirty-first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, under the authority of the said "Public Revenues Act, 1881."

14. The Schedules annexed hereto, with the notes, if any, to such Schedules, shall be deemed to be part of this Act, in the same manner as if they had been contained in the body hereof.
