# A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to authorize the Sale of a Reserve within the City of Auckland, and Title. to change the Purpose of a Reserve in the Vicinity of the said City.

WHEREAS by the operation of "The Abolition of Provinces Act, 1875," the Preamble. 5 lands described in the First Schedule hereto have become vested in Her Majesty the Queen in trust as a site and endowment for an industrial school, under "The Neglected and Criminal Children Act, 1867," and the lands described in the Second Schedule hereto have become similarly vested as an endowment for the support and maintenance of lunatic and other asylums within the Provincial 10 District of Auckland:

And whereas the lands lastly described could be more profitably utilized by appropriating the same for the purposes of an industrial school, and by erecting thereon suitable buildings out of the proceeds of the sale of the lands herein first described, which are too limited in extent for the purpose for which they 15 have been reserved:

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:--

- 1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Auckland Industrial School Reserve Short Title. Act, 1882."
- 2. This Act shall be deemed to be a special Act within the meaning of Act a special Act. 20 "The Public Reserves Act, 1881."

3. The Governor, on behalf of Her Majesty, may, at any time or from Governor may sell

Colonial Treasurer may advance moneys for erection of new industrial schools. 4. In anticipation of any such sale, and for the purpose of, or towards the erecting of buildings suitable and necessary for an industrial school on the lands described in the Second Schedule hereto, the Colonial Treasurer is hereby authorized to issue and pay, from time to time, any sums not exceeding four thousand pounds, on the requisition of the Colonial Secretary, 5 to such persons as he may appoint to receive the same, and such moneys shall be recouped out of the proceeds of the sales aforesaid, as they shall from time to time accrue.

- 5. The lands described in the Second Schedule hereto shall no longer be held in trust for the purposes hereinbefore recited, but henceforth shall vest in 10 and be held by Her Majesty the Queen in trust as a site and endowment for an industrial school under "The Neglected and Criminal Children Act, 1867."
- 6. "The Industrial School Act, 1872," of the Province of Auckland, is hereby repealed.

# SCHEDULES.

### FIRST SCHEDULE.

All that piece or parcel of land called or known as Lots forty-six, forty-eight, and forty-nine of Section six, Suburbs of Auckland, Otahuhu, and Titirangi Survey Districts, Provincial District of Auckland, and containing by admeasurement thirty-eight acres one rood twenty-four perches, more or less. Bounded towards the North by a public road-line, one thousand three hundred and fifteen links; towards the East by Lot forty-five of Section six aforesaid, eight hundred and thirty-four links; again towards the North by Lot forty-five aforesaid, one thousand three hundred and seventy links; towards the East by a public road-line, four hundred and forty-five and five hundred and seventy links; towards the South by Lot one hundred and eighty-two of Section ten, a public road-line one hundred links wide, and Lot sixty-eight of Section ten aforesaid, three thousand one hundred links; and generally towards the West by a public road-line, four hundred and thirty-three, five hundred and fifty-five, three hundred, three hundred and thirty-two, and four hundred and twenty links: be all the aforesaid linkages more or less.

### SECOND SCHEDULE.

ALL that piece or parcel of land called or known as Section fifty-five, City of Auckland, Waitemata Survey District, Provincial District of Auckland, and containing by admeasurement three acres, more or less. Bounded towards the North-east by Howe Street, five hundred links; towards the South-east by Hopetoun Street, six hundred links; towards the South-west by a public street, five hundred links; and towards the North-west by Smith Street, six hundred links: be all the aforesaid linkages more or less; together with all the buildings thereon.
