A BILL INTITULED

An Act to amend the Coal-mines Act, 1908.

Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as 5 follows:-

1. This Act may be cited as the Coal-mines Amendment Act, short Title. 1910, and shall form part of and be read together with the Coal-mines Act, 1908.

2. (1.) The Board of Examiners appointed under the Mining Board of Examiners 10 Act, 1908, and its amendments shall conduct all examinations of mine-managers in the manner prescribed by regulations, and all references in the principal Act and its amendments to the Board of Examiners shall be deemed to be references to the first-mentioned Board.

(2.) Section twenty-five of the principal Act is hereby repealed.

3. (1.) All persons who before the thirty-first day of December, Certificates of nineteen hundred and nine, had for a period of not less than twelve service as under-viewer or as fireman months held the position of underviewer or fireman and deputy in and deputy. 1 2300 any coal-mine may, on application to the Board of Examiners before 20 the thirty-first day of December, nineteen hundred and eleven, be

granted a certificate of service as underviewer, or as fireman and deputy, as the case may be.

(2.) This section is in substitution for subsection three of section Repeal. nine of the Coal-mines Amendment Act, 1909, and that subsection

25 is hereby accordingly repealed.

4. If any underviewer or fireman and deputy is incapacitated Underviewer's from performing his duties, or is about to be absent from the mine. for more than three days, the manager of the mine shall, in writing, appoint some person approved by an Inspector to act as the deputy 30 of that official during his incapacity or absence; but no such deputy shall act for more than fourteen days unless authorized so to do by the Inspector. No. 60-1.

Compensation for death or injury extended.

5. (1.) Notwithstanding anything in section fifty-five of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1908, any money paid out of the Sick and Accident Fund or the Coal-miners' Relief Fund in respect of the death or injury of any coal-miner shall not be deducted from any compensation payable under the Workers' Compensation Act, 1908, in respect of the accident that caused the death or injury.

(2.) Section eight of the Coal-mines Amendment Act, 1909, is

bereby repealed.

6. (I.) Section eighty of the principal Act is hereby amended by omitting the word "except" in subsection two thereof, and substitut- 10 ing the word "including," and by omitting the words "and one farthing per ton on all brown coal and lignite sold during the same period."

(2.) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in any coalmining lease or elsewhere, this section applies to coal-mines in 15 existence at the commencement of this Act as well as to those

thereafter opened up.
