A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend "The Criminal Code Act, 1893."

Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

- 5 1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Criminal Code Act 1893 Amendment Act, 1894 (No. 3)." Short Title.
2. "The Criminal Code Act, 1893" (herein referred to as "the said Act"), is hereby amended as follows:— "Criminal Code Act, 1893," amended.
- 10 3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the said Act, the Governor in Council may, upon application made on behalf of any person convicted of the crime of murder at any criminal sittings of the Supreme Court held since the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, by order in writing, Persons convicted of capital offence since 1st January, 1889, to have right of appeal.
- 15 direct that a new trial shall take place, at such time and before such Court as he may think proper, and thereupon all proceedings shall be taken and all acts done as if such trial had been directed under the provisions of sections four hundred and seventeen of the said Act.
