CINEMATOGRAPH-FILM CENSORSHIP AMENDMENT.

ANALYSIS.

Title.
1. Short Title.

2. Governor-General in Council may make regulations for censorship of film posters.

A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend the Cinematograph-film Censorship Act, 1916. Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

5 1. This Act may be cited as the Cinematograph-film Censorship Amendment Act, 1926, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Cinematograph-film Censorship Act, 1916 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act). Short Title.

10 2. (1.) The Governor-General may from time to time, by Order in Council, make regulations for the censorship of posters and other advertising-matter in connection with the exhibition of cinematograph-films and for prohibiting the display of any such matter that is of an objectionable nature, and may by such regulations prescribe fees to be paid in respect of such censorship. Governor-General in Council may make regulations for censorship of film posters.

15 (2.) Section seven of the principal Act shall apply with respect to posters and other advertising-matter as aforesaid displayed in contravention of any regulations made under this section, in the same manner as it applies to films exhibited in contravention of that Act.
