CLUTHA FLOODS RELIEF FUND TRUSTEES EMPOWERING.

2. Power to transfer balance of fund to Shipwreck Relief Society.

A BILL INTITULED

An Acr to provide for the Application of the Unexpended Title. Balance in the Hands of the Trustees of the Clutha Floods Relief Fund.

WHEREAS in or about the year one thousand eight hundred and Preamble. seventy-eight a fund, known as the Clutha Floods Relief Fund, was raised by public subscription or otherwise for the relief of persons who had sustained loss through the flood in the Clutha River in the year above mentioned: And whereas, after providing for all 10 known-claims against the said fund, there exists an unexpended balance of two hundred and eighteen pounds ten shillings and ninepence, which sum is now on deposit with the Bank of New Zealand at three per centum interest in the names of Charles Stephen Reeves and Keith Ramsay, both of Dunedin (hereinafter referred 15 to as "the Trustees"): And whereas it is expedient that power be given to the Trustees to apply the said unexpended balance in manner hereinafter appearing:

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same,

20 as follows:-

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Clutha Floods Relief Short Title. Fund Trustees Empowering Act, 1903."

2. The Trustees are hereby empowered to transfer the sum of Power to transfer two hundred and eighteen pounds ten shillings and ninepence, now balance of fund to 25 on deposit with the Bank of New Zealand aforesaid, together with Society. all present and future accretions of interest thereon, to the Shipwreck Relief Society of New Zealand.

New clause.

3. Before such payment is made it shall be the duty of the Inquiry to be made 30 Trustees, in consultation with the Colonial Treasurer, to inquire into before transfer. the circumstances and necessities of any person or persons who have sustained loss through the aforesaid flood and to apply the whole or such part of the said fund as such Trustees may think fit towards the benefit or relief of such person or persons; and any moneys not so 35 applied shall, with the consent only of the Colonial Treasurer and only upon his being satisfied that the Trustees have complied with the provisions of this section, be transferred as mentioned in section two hereof.

3. 4. The receipt in writing of the said sum, with interest as Receipt of Chair-40 aforesaid, signed by the Chairman for the time being of the Central man of Shipwreck Relief Society to be Executive Committee of the said Shipwreck Relief Society of New sufficient discharge. Zealand shall be a sufficient discharge from all liability in connection with the said moneys.
