A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend "The Canterbury Public Domains Act, 1872." Title.

WHEREAS it is expedient that a site should be provided for the erection of a College at Christchurch on part of the land there known as the Government Domain : Preamble.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. The Short Title of this Act shall be "The Canterbury Public Domains Act 1872 Amendment Act, 1874." Short Title.

2. The Superintendent of Canterbury may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Provincial Government Gazette*, set apart any portion not exceeding five acres of the land firstly described in the Schedule to "The Canterbury Public Domains Act, 1872," as a site for a College, and the land so set apart shall thereupon cease to be subject to the provisions of the said Act. Superintendent may set apart site for College.

3. The Superintendent may convey the land so set apart to the Canterbury College, incorporated by Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council of Canterbury, Session XXXIX. No. 4; and such land, when so conveyed, shall be held by the Canterbury College and their successors for ever upon trust, as a site for a College, and for buildings and enclosures connected therewith, and for no other purpose. Land set apart to be conveyed to College on trust.
