## A BILL INTITULED

An Act to amend "The Canterbury Public Domains Title. Act, 1872."

WHEREAS it is expedient that a site should be provided for the Preamble. erection of a College at Christchurch on part of the land there 5 known as the Government Domain:

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:-

1. The Short Title of this Act shall be "The Canterbury Public Short Title. 10 Domains Act 1872 Amendment Act, 1874."

2. The Superintendent of Canterbury may, by Proclamation to be Superintendent may published in the *Provincial Government Gazette*, set apart any portion Superintendent may published in the *Provincial Government Gazette*, set apart any portion College. not exceeding five acres of the land firstly described in the Schedule to "The Canterbury Public Domains Act, 1872," as a site for a 15 College, and the land so set apart shall thereupon cease to be subject

to the provisions of the said Act.

3. The Superintendent may convey the land so set apart to the Land set apart to Canterbury College, incorporated by Ordinance of the Superintendent College on trust. and Provincial Council of Canterbury, Session XXXIX. No. 4; and such land, when so conveyed, shall be held by the Canterbury College and their successors for ever upon trust, as a site for a College, and for buildings and enclosures connected therewith, and for no other purpose.
