A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to impose a Duty upon Corn and Flour Title.
 and to exempt certain Articles from Duties
 of Customs.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in
 Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as
 follows—

1. The Short Title of this Act shall be "The Customs Tariff Short Title.
 5. Amendment Act 1869."

2. From and after the day of one Duties to be levied.
 thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine there shall be raised levied
 collected and paid unto Her Majesty on the several articles mentioned
 in the first Schedule hereto imported into the Colony and on the
 10 first importation thereof the several duties specified and set forth in
 the said first Schedule hereto.

3. The Governor in Council may from time to time by Order in Governor may suspend operation of Act.
 Council suspend the operation of this Act with respect to the
 imposition of duties on any one or more of the articles mentioned
 15 in the second Schedule hereto upon which a duty is hereby
 imposed and such suspension shall commence on and after a day
 to be named in such Order and may in like manner by Order in
 Council revoke every such Order in Council and such revocation
 shall come into operation on a day to be fixed in such Order and
 20 notice of every such Order in Council shall be sent to the Collector or
 other Chief Officer of Customs at every port in the Colony and such
 Collector or other Chief Officer of Customs shall act in and about the
 receipt of Customs in accordance with the terms of the last Order in

Council of which he shall have received notice Provided always that no Order in Council suspending this Act in respect of any of the articles mentioned in the said second Schedule shall be made unless the Governor in Council shall be satisfied that the average price in New Zealand of such article exceeds the sum or price set against the name of such article in the said second Schedule and that no such Order in Council as last aforesaid shall be revoked in respect of any such article unless the Governor in Council shall be satisfied that the average price in New Zealand of such article does not exceed the sum set against the name of such article in the said second Schedule.

Sections 6 7 10 and 12 "Customs Tariff Act 1866" incorporated in this Act. Interpretation of section 12.

4. The sixth seventh tenth and twelfth sections of "The Customs Tariff Act 1866" shall apply to all the goods upon which a duty is imposed by this Act and any suspension or removal of the duty payable upon any such goods by any such Order in Council as aforesaid shall be deemed to be an increase or decrease by law in the duties of Customs chargeable thereon within the meaning of the said twelfth section.

Certain articles exempted from duty.

5. From and after the passing of this Act the articles specified in the third Schedule hereto shall be exempt from the payment of any Customs duty on the importation thereof into the Colony.

Wheat	6s. 6d. per bushel.
Oats	4s. 6d. per bushel.
Barley	5s. 0d. per bushel.

THIRD SCHEDULE.

MATERIAL specially imported for and to be used in the construction of Docks Machinery and apparatus specially imported for and to be used in licensed Distilleries and Breweries in the manufacture of Woollen or other textile fabrics or in Flax or Hemp dressing.
