A BILL for bringing into operation within the Colony certain Acts of the Imperial Parliament.

WHEREAS certain Acts of the Imperial Parliament specified in the Schedule hereunto annexed have been passed for the amendment of the Law, and it is expedient that the same be adopted and brought into operation within this Colony. Be it therefore enacted by the General Assembly of New Zealand as follows—

1. The several Acts of the Imperial Parliament specified in the Schedule hereunto annexed shall be taken to extend to this Colony, and shall be applied therein in the Administration of Justice in like manner as Acts of Parliament passed before the establishment of the Colony are applied.

2. This Act shall come into operation on the thirtieth day of September in the year 1856.

3. This Act shall be entitled and may be cited as the English Acts Act, 1856.
