A BILL INTITULED

An Act to continue the Operation of certain Expiring Enactments. Title, BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as 5 follows:-

1. This Act may be cited as the Expiring Laws Continuance Short Title. Act, 1919.

2. (1.) So much of the enactments mentioned in the Schedule Operation of hereto as may for the time being be unrepealed shall continue in certain expiring 10 force until the thirty-first day of August, nineteen hundred and continued twenty, and shall then expire unless further continued.

(2.) Subsection one of section ten of the War Legislation Repeal. Amendment Act, 1916, is hereby repealed.

3. The Mortgages Extension Act, 1914, is hereby amended as Amendments of **15** follows :—

(a.) By omitting from the title the words "during a state of consequential on war '';

(b.) By omitting from subsection one of section three the words "So long as a state of war exists in New Zealand, and for such period as may be prescribed by regulations hereunder, not exceeding six months after a state of war has ceased to exist," and substituting the words. "While this Act remains in force ";

(c.) By repealing subsections three and four of section three thereof; and

(d.) By omitting from subsection one of section nine the words "So long as a state of war exists in New Zealand, and for such period as may be prescribed by regulations hereunder, not exceeding six months after a state of war has ceased to exist," and substituting the words "While this Act remains in force."

4. (1.) Subsection one of section sixteen of the War Legislation Amendment Act, 1916, is hereby revived as from the commencement 10 of the thirty-first day of December, nineteen hundred and eighteen, and shall be deemed to have been in force on and after that date accordingly, and shall continue in force until the thirty-first day of December, nineteen hundred and twenty, and shall then be deemed to be repealed:

Provided that the repeal of the said section shall not be deemed to render illegal the payment, after the said thirty-first day of December, nineteen hundred and twenty, of any moneys due on that date or payable in respect of the year ending on that date.

(2.) Subsection two of the said section sixteen is hereby 20

repealed. 5. Section thirty-two of the Appropriation Act, 1916, is hereby amended by omitting the word "six" before the word "months" in subsection one and also in subsection four, and in each case substituting the word "twelve."

6. The Expiring Laws Continuance Act, 1918, is hereby

repealed.
