2. Power to issue certain licenses. By-laws.

A BILL INTITULED

An Act to extend the Powers of the Egmont National Park Title. Board.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand 5 in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Egmont National Park Short Title. Act, 1901," and it shall form part of and be read together with "The Egmont National Park Act, 1900" (hereinafter referred to as "the 10 principal Act").

2. (1.) Notwithstanding anything in the principal Act, it shall be Power to issue lawful for the Board to issue licenses for all or any of the purposes following, that is to say,—

(a.) To cut and remove dead timber only;

(b.) To win and remove stone or gravel for metalling roads;

(c.) To construct and use tramways for the removal of any such timber or road-materials.

(2.) The Board may from time to time make by-laws under the By-laws. principal Act prescribing—

 $(\tilde{d}.)$ The form of such licenses;

(e.) The conditions under which such licenses shall be issued; and

(f.) The fees payable on any such license.
