A BILL INTITLED

AN ACT to extend "The Fisheries Encouragement Act, 1885." Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand, in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Fisheries Encouragement Act, 1902." Short Title.

2. (1.) The bonus which is authorised by "The Fisheries Encouragement Act, 1885," to be paid for canned and cured fish shall, notwithstanding anything in that Act to the contrary, be paid for the year ending the thirty-first day of August, one thousand nine hundred and three. Extension of period during which bonus is payable.

(2.) From and after the last-mentioned date the bonus aforesaid shall altogether cease to be paid.

3. "The Fisheries Encouragement Act, 1901," is hereby repealed. Repeal.
