Title. 1. Short Title. | 2. Gold duty to be applied only for the development of mining industries within mining districts.

A BILL INTITULED

- An Act to limit the Application of the Revenues accruing from Title. the Export Duty on Gold produced in any District for the development of the Mining Industry within such District.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :---

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Gold Duty Application short Title. Act, 1887."

- 2. After the commencement of this Act, all revenues accruing Gold duty to be 10 from the export duty on gold produced in any borough or county, and applied only for the development of mining industries "The Financial Arrangements Act, 1876," shall be paid by him to districts. a separate account in the Borough Fund or County Fund, as may be the case; and shall from time to time be applied by the Council
- 15 of such borough or county, in such amounts as the said Councils shall respectively determine, in and towards the construction of roads other than main roads, and tracks, or in aid of the construction, extension, or repair of water-races, sludge-channels, tail-races, or for the encouragement of prospecting for gold or other minerals, or
- 20 otherwise as will tend to the development of the mining industry within the borough or that part of the county wherein such gold was produced; and it shall not be lawful for any Borough Council or County Council as aforesaid to apply any part of the said revenues to any purpose whatsoever other than as herein mentioned.
