A BILL INTITULED

An Act to establish a Division of Mental Hygiene of Title. the Department of Health and provide for Matters incidental thereto; and to make consequential Amendments to the Health Act, 1920, and other Enactments.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

- 1. This Act may be cited as the Health Amendment Short Title. Act, 1947, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Health Act, 1920 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).
- 2. (1) There shall be a Division of the Department Division of 15 of Health to be called the Division of Mental Hygiene. (2) As from the passing of this Act the Mental Hospitals Department established under the Mental Defectives Amendment Act, 1928, shall cease to be a Vol. V, p. 80s separate Department of State and shall be the Division 20 of Mental Hygiene established under this section.

- (3) The Division of Mental Hygiene shall be charged with the administration of the Mental Defectives Act, 1911.
- (4) In addition to the Director of the Division of Mental Hygiene provided for by section four of the principal Act (as amended by this Act) there shall from time to time be appointed a Deputy Director of that Division.

(5) All officers who on the passing of this Act hold permanent appointments as officers of the Mental 10 Hospitals Department shall be deemed to have been duly appointed as officers of the Department of Health.

3. (1) Section four of the principal Act is hereby amended by inserting in subsection two, after paragraph (a), the following new paragraph:—

" (aa) The Division of Mental Hygiene;".

(2) Subsection three of section four of the principal Act is hereby amended by omitting from paragraph (c), and also from paragraph (d), the words "with special qualifications in sanitary science ".

(3) Section twelve of the principal Act is hereby amended by omitting from paragraph (f) the words "not being services in connection with any institution established under the Mental Defectives Act, 1914".

4. (1) Section one of the Mental Defectives Act. 25 1911, is hereby amended by adding the following as subsection two thereof:—

"(2) This Act shall be read together with and deemed part of the Health Act, 1920."

(2) Section two of the Mental Defectives Act, 1911, 30 as amended by section three of the Mental Defectives Amendment Act, 1928, is hereby further amended as follows:--

(a) By omitting the definition of the "Director-General", and substituting the 35 following definition: "Director' means the Director of the Division of Mental Hygiene of the Department of Health ":

(b) By omitting the definition of the term "Minister", and substituting the following 40 definition: "' Minister' means the Minister of Health ".

- (3) Section seventy-eight of the Mental Defectives Act, 1911, as amended by section three of the Mental Defectives Amendment Act, 1928, is hereby further amended by omitting the expression "Director-5 General", and substituting the words "Director-General of Health ".
- (4) All references in the Mental Defectives Act, 1911, or in any other enactment, to the Director-General of Mental Hospitals or to the Deputy Director-General 10 of Mental Hospitals shall hereafter be read as references to the Director of the Division of Mental Hygiene and the Deputy Director of that Division respectively.

(5) Sections two, three, four, and six of the Mental Repeals. Defectives Amendment Act, 1928, are hereby repealed.
