## A BILL INTITULED

# An Act to empower the Hutt River Board to make and levy rates on a uniform scale

WHEREAS the Hutt River Board, a Board duly constituted under the River Boards Act 1908, is required to make and levy rates on a graduated scale according to a classification to be made by the Board of the rateable property within its district: And whereas the Board is satisfied that the respective lands contained in the separate subdivisions of the district 10 of the Board will derive practically equal benefit from the works which the Board has carried out and intends to carry out in the said separate subdivisions and in respect of which a rate or a special or separate rate may be made or levied: And whereas it is expedient to empower the Board to make 15 and levy in respect of each of such separate subdivisions a rate or a special or separate rate on a uniform scale:

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1. Short Title-This Act may be cited as the Hutt River Board Empowering Act 1956.
- 2. Interpretation—In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires,-

"Board" means the Hutt River Board:

"District" means the district of the Board duly constituted under the River Boards Act 1908.

3. Board may make and levy rates on uniform scale-Notwithstanding anything in section nine of the River Boards Amendment Act 1913, and in addition to the powers thereby conferred, the Board may in any year make and levy a rate or a special or separate rate on all rateable property in the 15 separate subdivisions of the district or in any defined part or parts of such subdivisions on a scale which may be uniform in respect of the rateable property in each of such separate subdivisions or such defined part or parts thereof.

4. Commencement—This Act shall be deemed to have come 20 into force on the first day of April, nineteen hundred and fifty-four.
