A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend the Local Elections and Polls Act, 1908. Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Local Elections and Polls Amendment Act, 1911. Short Title.

2. Section seventeen of the Local Elections and Polls Act, 1908, is hereby amended by adding thereto the following subsection:— Voters in polling-booth at close of poll to be allowed to vote.

“(2.) Every elector who on the close of the poll is present in a polling-booth for the purpose of voting shall be entitled to receive a voting-paper, and to mark and deposit it in the same manner as if he had voted before the close of the poll.”

When a day has been appointed for holding any ordinary or extraordinary election, or for taking a poll on any proposal, and such day has subsequently been proclaimed by the Governor as set apart for a public fast or thanksgiving or as a public holiday, the election shall be held or the poll taken on the same day of the week in the following week, and public notice of such altered date shall be given.</p>	<p>Where day of election appointed public holiday, election to be held on another day</p>
