A BILL INTITULED

An Act to confer on Leaseholders a Right to Vote at the Election of Title. Members of the House of Representatives.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in 5 Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Leaseholders' Qualification Short Title.

Act, 1882."

2. Every man of the age of twenty-one years and upwards, having Leaseholder entitled a leasehold estate in possession, situate within any electoral district to register and voto. 10 for the election of a member or members of the House of Representatives, of the clear annual value of ten pounds, held upon a lease which at the time of registration shall have not less than three years to run, or, having a leasehold so situate and of such value as aforesaid of which he has been in possession for one year or upwards at the time 15 of such registration, and not being registered in respect of any other

qualification for the same district, shall be entitled to be registered under "The Registration of Electors Act, 1879," and to vote at the election of members of the House of Representatives.

3. This Act shall be read as part of "The Qualification of Act to be part of 20 Electors Act, 1879," and all the provisions of that Act shall apply as original Act. though section two of this Act had been inserted therein.
