## A BILL INTITULED

An Act to constitute the Matakaoa County.

Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as 5 follows:-

1. This Act may be cited as the Matakaoa County Act, 1919. New.

Short Title.

1A. This Act shall come into operation on the first day of April, Commencement. nineteen hundred and twenty.

2. (1.) The Matakaoa County is hereby constituted, comprising Matakaoa County that portion of the Waiapu County (particularly described in the First constituted. Schedule hereto) which at the date of the passing of this Act

comprised comprises the respective areas included in the Awatere and Whangaparoa Ridings of the Waiapu County.

(2.) The boundaries of the Waiapu County as hereby altered

are described in the Second Schedule hereto.

3. From and after the coming into operation of this Act no Jurisdiction of local authority other than the Matakaoa County Council shall, within the limits of the said county, exercise any jurisdiction or authority 20 over any roads or over or in relation to any matter or thing in respect of which jurisdiction is conferred upon a County Council under any Act:

Provided that nothing herein shall affect the power of the Governor-General to proclaim any portion of the said county a 25 borough or town district.

4. No greater amount of subsidy shall be paid to the Matakaoa Amount of subsidy County Council in any year than would have been payable in respect to Matakaoa County Council. of the rates collected in the area thereof if this Act had not been passed.

#### FIRST SCHEDULE.

# Boundaries of the Matakaoa County.

COMMENCING on the seashore at the East Cape at a place called Te Horo-o-Kapuarangi, proceeding in a south-westerly direction by a straight line to Trigonometrical Station  $\check{\mathbf{E}}$ ; continuing by a straight line in a south-westerly direction to the northernmost corner of Subdivision 1A 2, Whakaangiangi Block (being also the western boundary of the Tangakaka Block), Block IV, Mangaoporo Survey District; continuing in a southwesterly direction generally by the north-western boundary of said Subdivision 1A2 and portion of north-western boundary of Section 5, Block IV, Mangaoporo Survey District; thence proceeding and passing through the aforesaid Section 5 by what was originally the north-western boundary of 1B1 and the north-eastern and north-western boundaries of 2A, Whakaangiangi Block, to the north-east corner of Whakaangiangi 2B1; thence by the northern boundaries of the said Whakaangiangi 2B1, 2B2, 2B3, 2B4, and 3B, and by the northern and western boundaries of Section 5, Block III, Mangaoporo Survey District, to the Tangihanga Block; thence by the northern boundary of the said block to the centre of the Taurangakautuku Stream; thence by the centre of that stream to the eastern boundary of Forest Reserve; thence by the western boundary of the Tangihanga Block to the northern boundary of the Wairongomai Block; thence by the northern boundary of that block and the northern boundary of Forest Reserve to Trigonometrical Station, Pakira, on the eastern boundary of the Opotiki County; thence in a northerly and westerly direction by the eastern boundary of the aforesaid county to the sea (by the eastern and northern boundaries of Forest Reserve Te Kumi No. 2 and Whangaparaoa No. 3); thence in a northerly, easterly, and south-easterly direction along the seashore to the point of commencement.

#### SECOND SCHEDULE.

#### BOUNDARIES OF THE WAIAPU COUNTY.

COMMENCING on the seashore at the East Cape at a place called Te Horo-o-Kapuarangi, proceeding in a south-westerly direction by a straight line to Trigonometrical Station E; continuing by a straight line in a south-westerly direction to the northernmost corner of Subdivision 1A 2, Whakaangiangi Block (being also the western boundary of the Tangakaka Block), Block IV, Mangaoporo Survey District; continuing in a southwesterly direction generally by the north-western boundary of said Subdivision 1A 2 and portion of north-western boundary of Section 5, Block IV, Mangaoporo Survey District; thence proceeding and passing through the aforesaid Section 5 by what was originally the north-western boundary of 1B1 and the north-eastern and north-western boundaries of 2A, Whakaangiangi Block, to the north-east corner of Whakaangiangi 2B1; thence by the northern boundaries of the said Whakaangiangi 2B 1, 2B 2, 2B 3, 2B 4, and 3B, and by the northern and western boundaries of Section 5, Block III, Mangaoporo Survey District, to the Tangihanga Block; thence by the northern boundary of the said block to the centre of the Taurangakautuku Stream; thence by the centre of that stream to the eastern boundary of Forest Reserve; thence by the western boundary of the Tangihanga Block to the northern boundary of the Waiorongomai Block; thence by the northern boundary of that block and the northern boundary of Forest Reserve to Trignometrical Station, Pakira, on the eastern boundary of the Opotiki County; thence proceeding in a south-westerly direction generally by right lines along the eastern boundary of the aforesaid Opotiki County, passing through portion of and by the southeastern boundary of Forest Reserve to Trigonometrical Station 1328, Whanakaoao, proceeding in a south-westerly direction by a right line and passing through the aforesaid Forest Reserve to Trigonometrical Station, Kapua, continuing in a south-westerly direction by a right line in the direction of Trigonometrical Station, Arowhana, and passing through Forest Reserve. Small-grazing Run 96, Maungawaru, and Huiarua No. 3 Blocks, till it intersects the eastern boundary of the Waipaoa No. 1A Block, this

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being the northernmost corner of the Waikohu County; thence in an easterly direction generally by the northern boundary of the aforesaid Waikohu County to the centre of the Mata River, this being the north-western corner of the Uawa County (by part of the eastern boundary of the aforesaid Waipaoa No. 1a, the northern boundaries of Small-grazing Run 98, Section 1, Block V, and Section 1, Block VI, Tutamoe Survey District); thence in a south-easterly direction generally by the northern boundary of the aforesaid Uawa County to the sea (by the hereinafter mentioned lines proceeding by the centre of the aforesaid Mata River to its junction with the Mangamauku Stream); thence by the centre of that stream till it reaches the intersection of the south boundary of Tauwhareparae 2B with the aforesaid Mangamauku Stream, proceeding in a southeasterly direction, 21700 links, by the northern boundaries of Lots 8, 9, 3A, and part of 3, Tauwhareparae Block: thence by straight lines and passing through the Tauwhareparae Block till it intersects the western boundary of the Tauwhareparae No. 3. Block, by the following lines—bearing 200° 29', distance 17000 links; bearing 78°, distance 4500 links; bearing 87°, distance 2550 links; bearing 118° 30', distance 11800 links; bearing 135°, distance 1600 links; bearing 93°, distance 7500 links; bearing 189° 30′, distance 6600 links; bearing 254° 30′, distance 4500 links; bearing 164° 29′, distance 10800 links; bearing 165° 21′, distance 1098 links; bearing 169° 41′, distance 5669 links; bearing 114° 30′, distance 2800 links; bearing 148°, distance 1100 links; bearing 134°, distance 1400 links, to Trigonometrical Station, Rimututahi: thence by lines bearing 30° 30', distance 5200 links; bearing 353° 15', distance 8700 links; bearing 82°, distance 12400 links, to Trigonometrical Station 171, Puakoto: thence by a line running due east, distance 12000 links, intersecting the western boundary of Tauwhareparae No. 3 Block; thence in a southerly direction by that boundary, 12800 links, to the south-western corner of the said Tauwhareparae No. 3; thence by the northern boundary of Lot 2 of Small Grazing-run 46, Mangatokerau 1c and Section 1, Block III, Uawa Survey District, to the centre of the Uawa River; thence in a southerly direction by the centre of that river till it intersects the northern boundary-line of Kopuatarakihi 2a produced to centre of the aforesaid Uawa River; thence in a north-easterly direction by the northern boundaries of the aforesaid Kopuatarakihi 2A, 1B4, 1A, and Kaiaua No. 1 Block, to the sea at Koangaumu; thence in a northerly direction generally along the seashore to Te Horo-o-Kapuarangi, the pointof commencement: and including East Island, otherwise known as Whangaokeno.
