A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend "The Married Women's Property Act, 1884." BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as fol-5 lows :---

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Married Women's Short Title. Property Act, 1894."

2. Every contract hereafter entered into by a married woman, Effect of contracts otherwise than as an agent,-

- (1.) Shall be deemed to be a contract entered into by her with $s_{1,1}$ 10 respect to and to bind her separate property, whether she is or is not in fact possessed of or entitled to any separate property at the time when she enters into such contract;
- (2.) Shall bind all separate property which she may at that time 15 or thereafter be possessed of or entitled to; and
 - (3.) Shall also be enforceable by process of law against all property which she may thereafter while discovert be possessed of or entitled to:
- Provided that in any action or other proceeding the onus shall 20be on the married woman of showing that she has no separate property:

Provided also that nothing in this section contained shall render available to satisfy any liability or obligation arising out of such 25 contract any separate property which at that time or thereafter she is restrained from anticipating.

3. 4. Section twenty-four of the Imperial Act shortly intituled

"The Wills Act, 1837," shall apply to the will of a married woman made during coverture, whether she is or is not possessed of or 5 entitled to any separate property at the time of making it; and such will shall not require to be re-executed or republished after the death of her husband.

5. Subsections three and four of section three of "The Married Women's Property Act, 1884," are hereby repealed.
